

WHAT IS THE FUNCTION OF THE THEATRE? We believe with Arthur Hopkins: "When a thousand people sit before us, appealingly receptive, how are we to enrich them? How often in our lives has theatregoing been an experience for which we will be forever grateful?... Are we to send people away exalted. compassionate, proud of being human beings, or are we to add to their frustration and cynicism? Chain reactions did not begin with the atomic bomb. It began with ideas. The theatre is essentially a place of ideas. What chain reactions do we want to set in motion?

THIS SEASON MARKS a turningpoint in the Gateway's ever changing history, with TEN productions rather than five, and a company of 18 instead of 8.

IN THE BEGINNING the Gateway was nothing but an empty barn and a handful of idealistic actors. Six years ago a press notice said, "The Gateway Players, a recently organized group of young actors will make their bow at 8:30 p.m. tomorrow in Shakespeare's "Taming of the Shrew", to be presented in the new 'theatre-in-the-round'." The following week a review said "If this youthful, enthusiastic company maintains as high a standard with its next production..... Bellport and the surrounding area is in for an enjoyable summer of interesting theatre."

NOW SUCCESSFUL the Gateway Theatre operates a student workshop which enrolls some thirty resident teenagers as well as adults from this area. Courses in all phases of the theatre are given daily in addition to student productions and dance concerts... the actors in the professional companies providing the drama instruction. Gateway is a member of the American National Theatre and Academy, and the American Educational Theatre Association.

THE ENSEMBLE consists of Sally Pomeran who returns to Bellport after a season in Europe. One of Gateway's founders, now general director. Miss Pomeran has had an extensive career in New York and on tour, the most vivid roles being in "Antigone", "Liliom", "Pygmalion", and "Taming of the Shrew". Educated at Principia College and Columbia University, Miss Pomeran studied drama under Frank Parker and then acted with C. W. T. in N. Y. for 3 yrs. and played leading roles at the Putney Theatre in Vermont. She is now leaving her post as head of the Putney School Drama Dept. to lead the Gateway Players in winter repertory.

DAVID SHELDON, also a Gateway founder, returns for his sixth acting and directing season in Bellport. Noted for a variety of char-(Cont'd on Pg.4)

BEVERLY WHITE, directing five of Gateway's ten productions, comes from Arena Stage, Washington, D.C. Formerly director of drama at the Putney School in Vermont, Miss White established the Putney Summer Theatre in 1947 and directed its work for six years. In the summer of 1950 she toured the British Isles with members of her company, representing the U.S.A. in an international festival sponsored by the British Drama League. Miss White has been associated with Weston Playhouse, Rollins Studio and McLean Summer Theatre and has instructed in the theatre departments of Wesleyan Univ. and Sarah Lawrence College.

The scene of the play is Prince Edward Island, a splinter of land, south of Newfoundland and northwest of Nova Scotia, jutting out into the mystery of the Atlantic, and known among the Maritime Provinces of Canada as the Garden Spot of the Gulf.

For the most part, the houses are of weather-beaten shingle, with tall peaked roofs to shed the winter weight of snow. A rickety railroad serves the length and breadth of the island; and in the outlying districts lives a hard-bitten race of farmers, who divide their time between fishing and tilling a stubborn soil.

The Play is laid to the eastern end of the Island near a town called Souris, a bleak little village, perched on a cliff with a winding road down to the wharves where the cod fishermen put in, and where the cod are gutted and salted. Each farmer has his pigs, sheep, geese, and cattle, the whole family sharing in the labor of the farm, from grand-mother who spins and works at her loom, to the children who help with the chores.

The Island is beset by furious summer storms. As skies clear, red-wheeled, one-horse carts may be seen winding down to the shore, where each farmer gathers his share of kelp, which is used as fertilizer. Once the fishing is over, the crops planted, these Scotch-Irishfarmers, with a sprinkling of French can relax in such diversions as picnics and dances, the fiddlers playing inherited tunes on instruments that have never been tuned.

This is the background of the play.




