ARENA theatre, now hitting the peak of its revival has become more and more successful the world over. Audiences seem to enjoy its intimacy. No longer need we buy the most expensive seat in the house to be able to enjoy more than a puppet like view of the action. Every seat provides an intimate view of the play.

ARENA, the original style of acting, goes back as far as the Greeks in their amphitheatres, and the Romans in their colosseums. In Shakespeare's day, the Elizabethan stage had the audience sitting on three sides of the actors. Regular proscenium stages, or the conventional theatre as we know it today, with the platform on one end of a hall, came with the artificiality of the Restoration era, and along with it came an artificial style of acting, whereby the actors would face front and shout lines to each other.

THEATRE, like everything else in our last century, has grown more and more realistic not only in its subject matter, but in its presentation. In consequences, we are experiencing, in our day, the inevitable change in the outward form as well.

TODAY, with all of our television and movies, people have become used to the intimacy of seeing people "up close." Having adjusted to the 3-Dimensional Cineramic, stereophonic screen, we are more aware, and ready for this same change in our theatres. Now that we can see and hear without effort, living theatre has become an experience as exciting as films but with twice as much pulse.

THE GATEWAY THEATRE, established in 1949, first used the arena style as an efficiency measure to save on building scenery. But the discovery of its values throughout the years caused the management, when face lifting time arrived, to invest not in the conventional proscenium, but in comfortable raised seating levels in-the-round, with a look toward the future.

IN THE 1956 SEASON, by its choice of the best of the Broadway plays, the Gateway Theatre in its informal arena setting is dedicated to bring LIVING theatre to MORE people.


