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



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

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#### About the play

On March 29, 1951 - just eight years after the premiere of their trail-blazing production of "Oklahoma!" Richard Rodgers and Oscar Hammerstein II graced Broadway with the masterful musical "The King and I."

Opening night was no more than a year from the day famed British actress Gertrude Lawrence called the pair asking if they would be interested in writing and producing a musical adaptation of Margaret Landon's novel "Anna and The King of Siam." Never having written specifically with one actor or actress in mind, they were hesitant, fearing such an arrangement might not give them the freedom they would need.

They did not come to a definite decision until after a screening of the Twentieth Century-Fox film adaptation of the novel starring Rex Harrison and Irene Dunne. That did it. It was obvious that the story of an English governess who travels to Siam to become school-teacher to the semi-barbaric monarch's children had the makings of a powerful musical play.

Despite Miss Lawrence's name in bold letters above the title and a brilliant portrayal, it was young Yul Brynner who commandeered the production. For more than three decades, Brynner WAS the King of Siam. His fame overshadowed the show at times and he played in it until shortly before his death.

In addition to its initial run of 1,246 performances at the St. James Theater in New York, the show has seen countless revivals on Broadway and in regional, summerstock, and community theaters everywhere. A faithful film adaptation of the stage musical also has helped "The King and I" become one of the most beloved musicals of all time.

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


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#### WHO'S WHO (in alphabetical order)

Dance Theatre, Northeast Ballet, the role of Drosselmeyer in COMPANY OF THE ARTS, Candlewood Playhouse's production of OKLAHOMA! The Stephen Harding Dancers in N.Y.C. His most recent credit was in the Downtown Cabaret Theatre's production of EVITA.
