He has appeared on all the major TV networks in roles that include featured appearances on THE DUPONT SHOW, THE DOCTORS, ONE LIFE TO LIVE THE ADAMS CHRONICIES, and THE BEST OF FAMILIES.

ROBERT WILDER (Musical Director) This production is Robert's first as Musical Director at Gateway. He has performed as keyboardist for several previous productions including TOMMY, SUGAR BABIES, and WEST SIDE STORY. It was during his graduate study in the flute that he began a career in theorier. Robert is the musical director at the Monomoy Theatre, Chatham, Cape Cod, and has also directed at the Cleveland Playhouse, Ohio Valley Summer Theater, and at several universities for their theater training programs. Works that he has directed include HELLO DOLLYI, THE MUSIC MAN, THE ROBBER BRIDEGROOM, A FUNNY THING HAPPENED ON THE WAY TO THE FORUM, MY FAIR LADY, and THE CAUCASIAN CHALK CIRCLE. He has also composed and arranged music for productions of THE GRAPES OF WRATH, DEATH OF A SALESMAN, and LYSISTRATA.

MICHAEL BOYER (Set Designer) has designed over 150 productions for Off-Broadway, summer stock, community theatre, university and amphitheater productions, ranging from CAT ON A HOT TIN ROOF to MORTICIANS IN LOVE. His sets have been seen from Singapore to Stockholm, and from Anchorage to Key West. Winters, Michael works at the Tennessee Williams Fine Arts Center and the Waterfront Playhouse, in Key West.

ROBIN JOY ALLAN (Casting Director) spent her childhood performing at Gateway, and after directing, teaching, and some producing, began casting in Manhattan in 1985. She worked with several Off-Broadway companies and then spent five years in Los Angeles, where she had the pleasure of working with Ron Howard, Rob Reiner, and Jerry Zucker as the Associate Casting Director on the films PARENTHOOD, WHEN HARRY MET SALLY, and GHOST. She led the search for unknowns, discovering Bathazar Getty for the remake of LORD OF THE FLES. She cast the television pilot of PARENTHOOD in 1989, giving Leonardo DiCaprio his first regular-series role, and most recently cast the Movie-of-the-Week WITNESS TO THE EXECUTION, starring Tim Daly. Ms. Allan now heads up the Gateway Acting School in Belliport and confinues her freelance casting career.

MARIBETH HUNTER (Production Stage Manager) returns for her second season at Gateway. Her favorite project so far is SHLEIMIEL THE FIRST, an original Yiddish Musical Comedy that she stage managed for the American Repertory Theatre in Cambridge, MA and its pre-Broadway tour. She has also worked with the Cheftenham Center for the Arts, the American Music Theatre Festival, the Philadelphia Drama Guild, the Philadelphia Prestival Theatre for New Plays, the George Street Theatre, and People's Light and Theatre Company, where she was the resident production stage manager for two years, including tours to Cyprus, Hungary, and Japan. Maribeth is dedicating her work this season to her mother.

CHRISTOPHER J. LANDY (Lighting Designer) marks his 13th show with Gateway. Past productions have included TOMMY, CRAZY FOR YOU, PHANTOM, CAROUSEL, WEST SIDE STORY, CITY OF ANGELS, and THE KING & I. He recently designed IVANOV at the Ohio Theatre, IDENTITY and PHOTOGRAPH at the Interflude Theatre, ANGEL STREET at the Westport Country Playhouse, and Cymbeline of TSOA. His work has also been seen at Playhouse 91, the Butane Group, Centennial Theatre Festival, the Samuel Beckett Theatre, the Union Square Theatre, Nada, 2nd Ave. Dance Co., Golden Apple Dinner Theatre, Cape Fear Regional Theatre, Millbrook Playhouse, Shawnee Playhouse, and Wagner College, Chris taught lighting last spring at New York City Technical College, and recently received his MFA in lighting and scenic design from NYU.

MARK CLARK (Sound Designer) is celebrating his fifth year as Gateway's Resident Sound Designer. He has designed all mainstage productions, and especially enjoyed working on PHANTOM, ONCE ON THIS ISLAND, GRAND HOTEL and TOMMY. Mark travelled to the Far East with GREASE and SOUTH PACIFIC, with stops in Hong Kong, Malaysia, Singapore, and Indonesia, and also toured the U.S. and Canada with MY FAIR LADY and 42nd STREET.

CHUCK BATCHELOR (Costume Designer) is the resident costume designer for Costume World's Theatrical Division, the nation's second largest costume outlet. He studied design at Slippery Rock University in Pennsylvania and at Point Park College in Pittsburgh. Formerly, Chuck was the resident costume designer with the Pittsburgh Lab Theatre and Music Theatre North in Potsdam, NY, Among the shows Chuck has designed are GRAND HOTEL for the Royal Palm Dinner Theatre of Boca Raton, Florida; Carleton Davis' New England Tour of PHANTOM; toured as the wardrobe supervisor with the National Tour of YOUR ARMS TOO SHORT TO BOX WITH GOD for Pyramid Entertainment in New York and LA CAGE AUX FOLLES, showcased at New York's Gateway Playhouse, Candlewood Playhouse and Sarasota's Golden Apple Dinner Theatre and SHOWBOAT for Florida's Gold Coast Opera.


