IIII COLGAN (Featured Singer) is pleased to be working at Gateway once again. This marks her sixth production for the company having last been seen as Wilhelmina in Gateway's Candlewood production of DRACULÁ. Previously at the Playhouses, Jill appeared as Milly in SEVEN BRIDES FOR SEVEN BROTHERS, the Annie Golden role in LEADER OF THE PACK and as a wife in JOSEPH THE **AMAZING TECHNICOLOR** DREAMCOAT. She also toured in their production of SHENANDOAH as Jenny Anderson. Other national tours include SEVEN BRIDES FOR SEVEN BROTHERS and BYE. BYE BIRDIE, Off-Broadway, Jill performed the role of Luisa in the long running New York production of THE FANTASTICKS. Regional credits include BEEHIVE, NUNSENSE II (Sister Amnesia), MEET ME IN ST. LOUIS (Esther), DAMES AT SEA (Joan), GREASE (Sandy), and OKLAHOMA! (Laurev).

JEAN MARC GIONET (Skater) started skating at the age of seventeen. After a brief career as an amateur, he began his professional career teaching figure skating in local clubs in his area. He re-oriented his career to become an interior and furniture designer. After an absence of 8 years from the ice, he made a comeback three years ago when he had the chance to join an Ice Theater Troupe. This was an opportunity for him to push his skating abilities and artistry further, and also challenge his limits and capacities as a skater.

JAYA KANAL (Skater) is happy to be performing at Gateway this holiday season. Jaya is a United States Figure Skating Association (USFSA) Gold Test Medallist in figures and freestyle, and a Certified Laban Movement Analyst. Before moving to Manhattan one year ago, she worked in computer support and taught skating in suburban Maryland. Currently, she studies modern dance and she performed with the Ice Theatre of New York in the 1996-1997 season.

FRANK KRONYAK (Character/Ensemble) has played close to twenty principal roles on the Gateway stage including Moonface Martin in ANYTHING GOES, the Second Comic in SUGAR BABIES, Mr. Mushnik in LITTLE SHOP OF HORRORS and Jack (the Fother) in BRIGHTON BEACH MEMOIRS. He has performed in over 200 American cities and in Asia, Europe and South America. He's delighted to be "home again" on the Gateway Stage.

MELANIE LAMBERT (Featured Skater) is from Medfield, MA and has been skating since the age of 2. She is a U.S. National medalist, two-time Eastern Sectional Champion and Olympic Festival competitor in pairs. Melanie also has an extensive background as a championship ladies competitor. She enjoys teaching skating as well as being a chöreographer. In her spare time she is an illustrator.

JOHN PAUL LICORI (Skater) or as his friends know him as "J.P.," began skating at the age of 7, in his hometown of Westport, Connecticut. J.P. now lives in Tampa, Florida where he skates at Busch Gardens and teaches at several local skating rinks. As well as a skater, J.P. is also a pro-florist and has won many floral competitions. J.P. is a 5 time U.S. National Competitor, has skated for 9 years with Disney on Ice - U.S. Tour and Asia Tour...Principal...and is also a Junior Men's Champion.

MARTIN MARCEAU (Skater) started skating at the age of 10. He always had this dream of flying, so when he started taking skating lessons and learned how to execute jumps his dream came true. For him the feeling of being in the air, even if it's just for a few seconds, makes him feel free, Martin has been on the Canadian National Team for 4 vears. He participated in a few international competitions and was a bronze medalist in the Zaareb Golden Spin of Yugoslavia in 1987. Martin auit the amateur world in 1989 to study pharmacy at the University of Montreal. When he graduated in 1992, he decided that he still wanted to skate and perform so he joined Walt Disney's World on ice as a principal skater. After fouring Asia, South America. Australia and Europe he went back home and decided on living a more stable lifestyle. He is now a full-time pharmacist, but when he has a chance to aet away from work for a few weeks and do what he loves doing the most, skating, he takes the ridel

SCOTT McGOWAN (Featured Singer) Is pleased to return to Gateway where audiences may remember him as Jean-Michel in LA CAGE AUX FOLLES (twice), John Jasper in DROOD and the Wolf/Cinderella's Prince in INTO THE WOODS. He has appeared in five different productions in the last year of FOREVER PLAID and recently was in St. Louis doing MEET ME IN ST. LOUIS. Scott has toured extensively with Theatreworks/USA, played Tony Whitcomb in the Kennedy Center's hit SHEAR MADNESS, appeared on ALL MY CHILDREN (don't blink) and when not attending movies can be found scoping out office supply stores.

SHELLANNE MELLOR (Skater) is originally from Saskatchewan, Canada. At age two she learned to skate at the local ice rink on a 1983-1993 session. From represented Saskatchewan in Western Canadian competitions. Feeling unfinished with the amafeur ranks she joined Ice Capades in the fall of 1993. This professional direction not only allowed her to continue to develop her lyrical, classical style but also enabled her to travel throughout Canada, United States and Asia. Shellanne is pleased to have her theatre debut at the Gateway Playhouse.

**DAVID NICKEL** (Featured Skater) is a former member of the Canadian National Team and has been professionally skating for the past 12 years. He has been featured as a soloist, adagio, and ensemble performer, as well as choreographer, performance director, production assistant, and line captain. Some' recent live productions include THE NEXT ICE AGE at the Kennedy Center in Washington D.C. and 20th Century Fox's ANASTASIA in Las Vegas. Television credits include Disney's CHAMPIONS ON ICE, and THE LATE SHOW WITH DAVID LETTERMAN.

SHANA OLSZEWSKI (Skater) is a Pennsylvania native, who began skating at the age of 7. She is a USFSA Gold Medalist who enjoyed an 8 year competitive career which included several regional and sectional championships. After a short break from skating, including attendance at Temple University, Shana returned to professional figure skating, both as a coach and as a performer. Most recently Shana has been performing at Busch Gardens/Tampa.

DAWN M. PATERSON (Skater) lives in Sun Valley, Idaho where she is a professional skating instructor for competitive, hockey and recreational skaters. Dawn is a USFSA gold medalist, former Ice Follies/Holiday on Ice performer and has choreographed the Sun Valley Ice Show. Along with her skating interests, Dawn was a U.S. luge team member, North American luge champion and raced in international and World Cup competitions. She is also a competitive trapshooter, fly fisherman, upland bird hunter, skler and private pilot.

**TODD PRICE** (Featured Skater) is a three time United States Figure Skating Team member and seven time U.S. National Competitor. Todd along with former pairs skating partner Cheryl Marker finished 5th at the 1995 U.S. Figure Skating Championships. In addition to his 11 years of competitive skating experience, Todd recently completed his degree in psychology from the University of Minnesota in his home town of Minneapolis, MN.

KIM REALE (Featured Skater) a Double Gold medalist, is a native of West Redding, Connecticut and has performed as the star skater for the last ten years in both Atlantic City and Las Vegas in the ice and stage spectacular 'City Lites.' Kim has also performed as the lead skater in other Las Vegas productions such as LE ICE SHOW, ENTER THE NIGHT, and THE FREEMONT STREET EXPERIENCE. Kim started skating at the age of five and has trained in Lake Placid, New York, Toronto, Canada, and Sun Valley, Idaho. She competed nationally for 10 years and won many awards. Kim has also trained extensively in ballet and Jazz. When Kim is not skating, she does commission art work drawing children's illustrations and painting in oil. Kim is very happy to be performing back on the east coast where she considers New York and New England her home.

ROBERTA SHERIDAN (Singer) makes her Gateway debut with HOLIDAY SPECTACULAR ON ICE. Recent credits include Kristine in CHORUS LINE, Frenchie in SWEET CHARITY, the Witch in THE WIZARD OF OZ, and Pocahontas in POCAHONTAS. Roberta is a graduate of Fordham University at Lincoln Center, and would like to thank her family and friends for their constant support.

NICOLAS SOUREN (Ice Jugaler) As first-rate iuaglers ao, lean Nicolas Souren is unique: he can exhibit his rapid-fire manipulations with or without Ice skates! Of French lineage. Nicolas has donned blades for his present and first ever engagement in the Gateway Playhouse's ice spectacular. In his mid-20s, Nicolas comes from one of Europe's best known and most versatile circus clans, the Zerbinis. His mother, Maya, is also appearing in the current Gateway production with her trained Parisian Poodles. Also skilled as a rollicking acrobat and aifted equilibrist, Nicolas believes that juggling is his show Having juggled forte. business boyhood, he features a speedy routine, and is one of the few artists anywhere to have simultaneously spun as many as nine hoops overhead. During his widely acclaimed career, he has appeared performing throughout the U.S. and Canada at major state and regional fairs/expositions; in leading amusement/theme parks; and with numerous big top and arena style circuses. Unmarried, he is assisted in his act by a younger brother, Sampion, also a juggler, and, on occasion, by his mother, Maya.

MARY-ANN TRIPPET (Character/Ensemble) is pleased to be returning to Gateway/Candlewood Playhouse after playing the mean-spirited Alma Hix in MUSIC MAN last spring. Having just portrayed another "meanie"- Gladys McGlone in THE UNSINKABLE MOLLY BROWN for Dutch Apple Dinner Theatre, she's thrilled to play a jovial character for the holiday season!

JASON WAHL (Skater) is making his debut for Gateway with HOLIDAY SPECTACULAR. Having been a national competitor in figure skating he is also experienced in theatre and music. Favorite performances include the Rabbi's son in FIDDLER ON THE ROOF and a series of one acts by John Patrick Shanley at Stella Adler Conservatory of Acting. Jason is currently a figure skating coach in Philadelphia and would like to thank his parents, his siblings, Lisa-Lisa, Jason, Adam, Cecelia, and Naomi for their love and understanding.

MAYA ZERBINI (Trainer/Presenter - Zerbini's Parisian Poodles) is still taking in grandstand revues at leading state and regional fairs, tented arena and open-air circuses, amusement/theme parks and corporate events. These are the normal venues for Maya Zerbini's Parisian Poodles; a highly entertaining, multi-membered, trained dog act presently making its appearance at the Gateway Playhouse. The poodles, ranging

from standard to miniature and toy size breeds, will be performing atop a carpet that covers the playhouse rink. Maya explains that the audiences will see that these are happy, well-trained and nicely cared-for animals that truly like to perform. The attractive Ms. Zerbini, a mother of three, hails form a rich, French circus heritage that previously found her working as a featured solo trapezist, acrobatic balancer and bareback rider in both her native Europe and after arriving in the States some 20 years ago. When not touring, she lives in Sarasota, Florida, with what she fondly calls her, "two famillies—my children and my French Poodles."

PAUL ALLAN and JOHN HODGE (Producers) have been theatrical partners since 1982. Between them, they have over 30 years of experience, ranging from Broadway and Off-Broadway to Regional Theatre and the last 15 years of Gateway productions. Paul and John worked on the NYC productions of GROUCHO, DIAMONDS, JUST SO, and PACIFIC OVERTURES. They have produced and International tours SHENANDOAH, SWEET CHARITY, ANYTHING GOES, SONG AND DANCE, CAMELOT, A CHORUS LINE, SOUTH PACIFIC, 42nd STREET, and OLIVER and had the distinguished honor of bringing the first American-produced musical to Singapore with their touring production of THE SOUND OF MUSIC in 1990. For the last three years, they have also been Candlewood Gáteway's operating. Playhouse in New Fairfield, Connecticut. Upcoming projects include international WIZARD OF OZ THE of SOPHISTICATED LADIES.

JOHN SHERIDAN (Director) has performed on Broadway in GYPSY with Ethel Merman, NO, NO NANÈTTE with Ruby Keeler, and GYPSY with Anaela Lansburv receiving a Theater World award for his performance as Tulsa. Tours include GEORGE M, the London and Las Vegas companies of HELLO DOLLY as Barnaby with Mary Martin, then Betty Grable. Off-Broadway: BEST FOOT FORWARD with Liza Minelli, Repertory company of Lincoln Center, and Manhattan Theater Club. Films: SPLASH, and Woody EVERYONE SAYS I LOVE YOU. He directed and choreographed productions of MAME, HELLO DOLLY, GYPSY, NO, NO NANETTE, and Harvard's HASTY PUDDING show for three vears. He created ice shows for Rockefeller Plaza and South Street Seaport, corporate entertainments, and six revues for Chandris Cruise Lines. He's just conceived and coauthored a new musical THE CIRCUS ADVENTURE OF TOBY TYLER, which he hopes to debut soon...in a circus tent!

**KEN SHELLEY** (*Ice Choreographei*) was a 3-time U.S. National Pairs Champion and twice World Bronze Medalist with partner JoJo Starbuck. He was also U.S. Men's Champion, the last of only four skaters to ever win two national titles in the same year. In 1972, he

competed in both pairs and men's at the Winter Olympic Games in Sapporo, Japan (the only athlete since 1936 to do so) and was awarded the Gustavus Town Kirby Award as the "Outstanding Sportsman" of those Olympics. He was the headliner with "Ice Capades" and has performed all over the world in numerous live and televised skating exhibitions, shows and competitions. Ken has also worked in a variety of positions in theatrical administration and production on Broadway, Off-Broadway and most recently with "American Ballet Theatre." Ken & JoJo were twice named the "Professional Skater of the Year" in 1983 and 1987 and were recently inducted into the United States Figure Skating Hall of Fame.

LIZ REDDICK (Stage Manager) is pleased to loin the Gateway staff for this year's HOLIDAY SPECTACULAR ÓN ICE. Liz most recently stage managed DRACULA..., A ROCK OPERA, JOSEPH... and ME AND MY GIRL at Gateway's Candlewood Playhouse in Connecticut. She has stage managed over 100 different productions between Texas. Virainia and New York. Alona the way she has also been a professional wrangler of marionettes. (Dallas Puppet Theater) eccentric charàcters (Jekyl & Hyde Club, Manhattan) and children in THE WIZARD OF OZ (Madisón Square Garden). Liz holds a degree in English Literature and Theatre from Austin College in Sherman, Texas.


