JOSEPH MINUTILLO (Director) has been teaching theatre and directing for over 18 years. Some of his productions have included, MIRACLE WORKER. ARSENIC AND OLD FRANKENSTEIN, LADIES OF THE JURY, THREADS, WAIT UNTIL DARK, FOOLS, CRIMES OF THE HEART and THE EFFECT OF GAMMA RAYS ON MAN IN THE MOON MARIGOLDS, to name a few. Additionally, he has been involved in developing a theatre program of study for the New York State Education Department and the new Standards for Theatre Arts. His credits cover a wide range of scripts, from SWEET CHARITY to KEELY AND DU. He wishes to thank Kate and Jen for all the support and understanding.

MARIBETH HUNTER (Production Stage Manager) returns to Gateway after marrying her long-time love, Chris, whom she met at Gateway during her two seasons as Production Stage Manager. Her most recent tour was PORGY AND BESS to Australia, New Zealand, Tawain and the UK. Also this year she stage managed the Italian National Opera's US tour of Pagliacci/Cavalaria Rusticana.
