






he Great War had ended less than five years before, and postwar depression had given way to an atmosphere of prosperity. Singer Hank Williams was born, actress

who was succeeded by Calvin Coolidge. Howard Carter was in Egypt, excavating the tomb of Tutankhamen, which he had discovered the previous November. It was 1923. F. Scott Fitzgerald was the most popular author, Flappers were in fashion, and in Patchogue, a new theater was born.

On Wednesday, May 23, 1923 Mike Glynne, a theatrical entrepreneur, opened a new theater to rival any on Long Island. Named after himself and his late partner Joseph Ward, Ward and Glynne's Patchogue Theatre was "palatial" and "magnificent in its interior decorations and appointments." It boasted a state-of-the-art geothermal air cooling system "whereby cool, fresh air will be rushed

into the theater from the floor line by fan drivers and sucked out at the ceiling line by four, seven foot typhoon fans above the ceiling." With over 200 square feet of ventilators this provided a complete

change of air every five minutes.

A marvel for its time.

Opening Weekend Bill in 1923

With a seating capacity of almost 1500, the theater showed silent movies with a glittering array of the biggest stars of the day including Pola Negri, Gloria Swanson, Betty Compson, Rudolf Valentino, Buddy Rogers and all the Barrymores. Thomas Meighan, the star of the opening night movie "The Ne'er Do Well" attended the opening of the theater along with Charles Scwab, a friend and supporter of Mr. Glynne's. The theater also attracted the best acts of vaudeville. Hand picked by Mr. Glynne were such acts as John Phillip Sousa, Paul Whiteman, and Eddie Fov and the Seven Little Foys. But by the 1930's vaudeville was dead. People now

wanted to see the

"talkies" which were

being churned out of Hollywood at an incredible rate. The Ward and Glynne became strictly a movie palace.

In 1929 the theatre was sold to Prudential Theatre Circuit and it remained a movie theater for the next forty plus years, but time was not kind. In 1958 a fire destroyed the lobby and it was rebuilt along smaller lines and several store fronts were added to the front of the building. In 1980 United Artists bought the building. Multiplexes were the rage, and the Patchogue Theater was split into a triplex, destroying its interior. Plaster columns were smashed, sheetrock and wallpaper were installed, and ceilings were dropped. Unfortunately, the theater failed a few years later and stood empty, forlorn and derelict until last year.

In 1997 the Patchogue Village Board, headed by Mayor Steve Keegan, bought the theater and applied for grants to renovate and restore the building to its former glory. A new lobby was designed by New York Design Studios featuring a mahogany bar and Art Deco style bathrooms. Meanwhile, Mayor Keegan approached Gateway Playhouse producers Paul Allan and John Hodge about the project and they came on board as theatrical consultants.

Since the Village envisioned a Performing Arts Center, construction was begun to address modern theatrical requirements. The building was repointed and brick walkways to the parking lot were built. 2500 feet of conduit were installed beneath the floor to bring 2000 amps into the building. 60,000 pounds of steel were installed on the stage to be able to support up to 17 tons of lighting and scenery in the air. The building had to be reinforced to accommodate this and supporting columns were installed. 1000 period seats were obtained from Manhattan's Imperial Theater.

In the winter of 1998, following the completion of the new grid and fly system, Gateway produced a holiday show, *Nutcracker On Ice*. The show was a resounding success. Meanwhile, Gateway Playhouse producers Paul Allan and John Hodge were looking for a second venue in addition to their Bellport playhouse in order to expand their business to a

year round operation. Recognizing the potential of the new theater, Allan and Hodge submitted a bid to become the operators of the venue. This summer their bid was accepted and Gateway was selected to run the theater for the Village on a five-year lease.

In August of this year the next phase of construction began. Chet Mitrani a fourth generation plasterer from Center Moriches, restored and repaired the plaster work on the auditorium walls, tapestry

wall fabric was installed and an antique chandelier obtained from California. The seats were repaired, repainted and recovered. A 5,000 square foot addition was built to accommodate extended wing space for larger, modern sets and new dressing rooms.

The renovation is ongoing; plaster still needs to be painted and gilded, and the dressing rooms need to be completed, but the former Ward And Glynne Theater is once again the jewel of downtown Patchogue.

Ashlev and Tilly, the who share the role of Toto, belong to renowned theatrical animal trainer William Berloni, who trained the original Sandy in Annie on Broadway. Berloni became a trainer by accident working as a 19 year-old actor at Goodspeed Berloni.

Opera Company when Annie was in workshop, he was asked to find a dog to train since the company could not afford a professional. He promptly went off to the local animal shelter, buying a dog for \$7. "I soon discovered I was more talented as an animal trainer than an actor, and stuck with it," Berloni said. Twenty years later, he now has a thriving business providing animals of his own, as well as using a network of pet owners and exotic animal handlers, for film, commercials, advertising and theater across North America.

All of Berloni's dogs are rescue animals, and he obtained Ashley and Tilly through The Southern New England Cairn Terrier Rescue Club. "Ashley was a breeding dog, she lived in a cage and her sole purpose was to be impregnated," said Berloni, "When she was five she wasn't producing her quota of litters and they were going to euthanize her. When we got her she had never been socialized, didn't know what people **HSHLEY** TILLY

were, didn't know

what toys were.

She looks older than she is because producing so many puppies left her prematurely aged from stress." Tilly once belonged to someone who wanted to breed dogs, but didn't like it and gave them up. These people didn't want to listen to several dogs barking all the time, and Tilly's vocal cords were cut. "Now that we have them, we treat these dogs with love and affection, and they have blossomed into these creatures that love to please," said

"When I hire trainers, my prerequisites are that you love animals, and know nothing about animal training," said Berloni who teaches handlers his own methods. The handler accompanies the dogs and trains them to perform with the particular production in which they are cast, and acts as their advocate. "I have about ten people who do this because they love it. Most of them are interested in theater, and are writers or actors. I call them when an animal needs to go out on the road. I consider them part of my family because they take care of my animals. They take it as a very serious commitment. I miss my dogs, and I will go out and check up on them while they are in a show."

A.J. Sullivan is the handler taking care of Ashley and Tilly while they are working for Gateway Performing Arts. He also unintentionally became a trainer when, as an actor working on the 1992 production of Annie,

he was introduced to Berloni by the dog handler. A Wizard of Oz tour lost their handler for medical reasons and Sullivan was sent in.

The role is demanding for the little dogs, as Toto is on stage for almost the entire play. They must trust Dorothy, and get used to a new Dorothy for each production, as well as learn any different blocking a new director might use and be broken of habits developed for past productions. With a short rehearsal period, such as in this production, Sullivan will work with the director to use behaviors the dogs already know. "People ask if Toto can do tricks. Just getting Toto to stay in Munchkinland with the Munchkins dancing around her is a trick," said Sullivan. The actors must also be trained to be able to cover in case the dog gets distracted and doesn't perform on cue. Ashley performs through most of the show, Tilly comes on for scenes where Toto is carried to give Ashley a break and to learn the ropes since she has only been with Berloni for eight months. They were first housebroken and taught basic commands, like any pet. They were then sent out on the road just to have fun, to get used to theaters and people. Berloni believes that theatrical animals must first be acclimated to the environment of theaters so they can feel secure enough to perform in them. "Once we see they are getting bored with it, we then start teaching them the show," he explained.

When Sullivan first arrives at a new theater, he lets Ashley and Tilly explore the space. "I first ask if there are any baits around for

mice or whatever. I put the dogs down and watch them as they sniff around, to see which areas they feel insecure in or afraid of. We get our own dressing room which lets me contain the animals so I can bring them onstage when it is safe." Sullivan is responsible for the health of the dogs while they are on the road. "It is a 24 hour job, Toto never takes off his costume," said Sullivan who keeps a list of the 24 hour veterinarians in whichever city they are working in. On tour, Sullivan and the dogs had their own van, for this production in Patchogue, Kristin Maloney, the actress playing Dorothy picked them all up; the dogs are never flown as cargo or quarantined. When they are not working, Ashley and Tilly live with Berloni, his family, and his animals on a fenced four acre farm in Connecticut. "People ask how much training we do every day, we do nothing! My dogs know how to learn, the rest of the time they are just dogs, dirty and muddy and barking. That is what makes them so welladjusted," Berloni said. When they get too old to work, Berloni will retire them to his farm. "The retired dogs do miss performing, though," he said.

Berloni has just been hired to provide a dog for a new Broadway musical next season based on the Danny Kave film Hans Christian Andersen, which will star Jim Dale. He loves his job, Sullivan agrees. "Thanks to Toto, I've had the opportunity to see all of the US except Hawaii, and we have been to Mexico, South Korea, and Canada," he said. Ashley and Tilly seem to prefer an actor's life, too.

SPOTLIGHT On...

As audiences become more demanding, theatrical producers are incorporating more special effects into their shows. Performers who can fly, swooping effortlessly over the stage never fail to dazzle and amaze the spectators, who wonder, "How do they do that?"

Paul Rubin, the technical illusionist with ZFX, the company responsible for the flying in *The Wizard Of Oz* says, "We use two track systems, similar to curtain tracks, with one rope that travels a performer across the stage and another that travels them back. There is also a rope that raises and lowers the person." The track is a 3-inch eye beam that comes in 4', 5', 8' and 10' lengths, allowing ZFX to combine them to any length depending on the theater space.

The performer is attached by means of a harness to cables that are 1/16 of an inch thick, about the thickness of kite string. Rubin's company works with set designers whenever possible to make certain these cables won't be damaged, and to troubleshoot any problems that could hamper the production. Once the set has been constructed, the flying apparatus remains with it for rentals.

The harness is a new design ZFX has made of webbing and neoprene padding, an improvement on the old leather and steel harnesses with felt padding. "Actors complained because those were so rigid. We also changed the layout of where the straps go around the legs, so that it is more like a seat," said Rubin, "Even the connection device is our design, it is a quick release that can be changed in two seconds." The flying in Peter Pan, starring Cathy Rigby, was created by ZFX who designed a pendulum rigging enabling Rigby to fly 20 rows out over the audience in a free circular pattern. The new harness enabled Rigby to perform somersaults and complicated aerial stunts. "She is just great, she makes what we do look unimportant," said Rubin. ZFX is constantly striving to improve on the apparatus, always working toward the concept of "smaller is better."

ZFX has also designed the flying for the Blues Clues Live tour, and Saturday Night Fever. "We've done flying for Babylon 5, where they weren't really flying, they were supposed to be weightless," said Rubin, whose company has iust done the teasers for NBC's Thursday night lineup. The company also gets calls from people doing shows or commercials in outdoor venues. "The hardest job we had was flying a character outdoors on the beach at Vera Cruz in Mexico," said Rubin, "It was for a commercial and he had to fly into the camera shot with sand dunes in the background. We rigged 90 feet of scaffolding about 20 feet from shore, making sure it was safe. He had to be able to travel right to left, up and down, and back and forth. I had to rent a camera boom crane and rig a track off that." Rubin has even pointed out flying possibilities for shows that initially seemed not to require flying at all.

For a show like *The Wizard Of Oz* at Patchogue Theater, ZFX provides a three-day package. "We come in and install the equipment on the first day and train the theater's technicians on the basics. Over the next two days we explain the concepts of flying, how to make people go faster, how to stop them, and how to make it look natural," explained Rubin.

ZFX has been in existence for five years, and Rubin has big plans. "Every year I have a gauge, where do I want the company to be by the end of that year? Somewhere in the future I want us to be the industry standard. It is a great business. Everybody has a dream, some people dream they can be invisible, some dream they can fly. In the industry we are in, we can make that dream a reality."




