The honorary Oscar is the motion picture industry's highest acknowledgement of film legends. It is given only occasionally, and the select recipients include such names as Charles Chaplin, Gary Cooper, Cary Grant, Henry Fonda, Joan Crawford, Laurence Olivier and Deborah Kerr. In 1983, it was presented to Mickey Rooney.

The consummate performer, Mickey Rooney made his first stage appearance at the age of one when he crawled out on stage during his parents' vaudeville act. Mickey was born Joe Yule, Jr., on September 23, 1920 in Brooklyn, son of well-known performers Joe Yule and Nell Carter.

All of Mickey's seventy-nine years have been busy. At five, he made his motion picture debut, as a midget in "Not To Be Trusted." A year later, he became Mickey McGuire for seventy-eight short film comedies based on Fontaine Fox's tough little cartoon character. He outgrew the role at twelve and went on the road taking the name of Mickey Rooney.



His motion picture career would encompass such movie classics as "Boys' Town," The "Andy Hardy" films, "The Human Comedy," "National Velvet," "Midsummer Night's Dream," his beloved teamings with Judy Garland and more recently, "The Black Stallion." In his career, he has had multiple Oscar nominations and a Best Actor Emmy for "Bill." Mickey Rooney's versatility was proven again during his eight year run in the Broadway smash "Sugar Babies."

In the 1930's, he signed with Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer for whom he made the famous "Andy Hardy" series. Box office receipts for 1938-1940 made him the number one star in the world. In 1939, he received a special Academy Award® for the film "Boy's Town" with Spencer Tracy and for his work in the Andy Hardy series. This was also the year he made his first major musical with Judy Garland, "Babes in Arms," which earned him an Academy Award® nomination as best actor. It was the first time a juvenile had competed with adult stars for the honor.

The next time he was so honored was in 1943 for his work in "The Human Comedy." It could be said that Mickey Rooney made his first "adult" appearance in "National Velvet" with Elizabeth Taylor in 1944, before joining the army. After the war, Rooney set about rebuilding his career. He worked on movies such as "The Bridges At Toko-Ri" and "Breakfast at Tiffany's" as well as working on television, stage, nightclubs and Las Vegas.

The list of his credits for the past six decades is impressive, containing more than three hundred films, such as "A

Midsummer Night's Dream," "Little Lord Fauntleroy," "Captains Courageous," "National Velvet" and the "Twinkle In God's Eye" (directing and composing the film score). He continued to please audiences in "Breakfast at Tiffany's," "It's A Mad, Mad, Mad, Mad World," "Pete's Dragon," "The Bold and the Brave," and "The Black Stallion" again he also received Academy Award® nominations for the latter two films.

Mickey has also been active in many classic dramas, such as "The Comedian," earning an Emmy nomination. In 1982, he portrayed Bill Sechter in the television film "Bill" and "Bill On His Own" receiving an Emmy, The Golden Globe, and the Peabody Award for his performance.

In 1979, Mickey achieved a new triumph, which took him to the cover of "Life" magazine, the starring role in the theatrical production of "Sugar Babies." The show ran successfully on Broadway for three years and had a record breaking eight-year run. In 1988, Mickey wowed London's West End audiences in "Sugar Babies."

His stage success continued in 1989 when he and Donald O'Connor made a twenty-city tour in "Two For The Show," which they co-wrote. In 1990, they enjoyed similar success, with a thirteen-city tour in Neil Simon's "The Sunshine Boys."

More active than ever, his 1991 schedule included starring in The Family Channel Network's "The Adventures of the Black Stallion" series, the European theatrical feature "The Milky Life," release of "My Heroes Have Always Been Cowboys," which teamed him with Scott Glenn and Ben Johnson and the publication of his longawaited autobiography, "Life Is Too Short" by Random House.

During 1993, Mickey starred in the play "Lend Me A Tenor" in Chicago; he also did "The Will Rogers Follies" on Broadway. He taped an episode of "Murder She Wrote" and recently completed the film, "The Legend Of O.B. Taggart" which he also wrote.

In 1994, he did a successful tour of his One Man Show "Mickey Rooney in Mickey Rooney" with his wife Jan and Jenifer Green in Australia. In 1995, he revived "Sugar Babies" with Juliette Prowse at the Dunes Hotel in Las Vegas. Later that year he was in Toronto, Canada doing "Crazy for You," a stage revival of his 1943 film "Girl Crazy." In 1996 he went to Jordan for the film "Sinbad and the Dark Knights" with Richard Greico and to Moab, Utah for "Animals" with John Tutturro and Tim Roth. 1997 brought him

back to Australia to film the sequel to the hit film "Babe" with director George Miller, "Babe, Pig in The City." Still going strong, for the last two years, Mickey has been touring the United States and Canada as "The Wizard" and "Professor Marvel," in Madison Square Gardens' highly acclaimed stage production of "The Wizard Of Oz."

Mickey is also an accomplished musician and can play almost every instrument in an orchestra. As a member of ASCAP, Mickey has composed numerous pop songs, a symphony and several film scores. Vic Damone and Kathy Lee Gifford recently recorded his song "Love is Being Loved." He is truly a perpetual motion machine. He is an avid golfer and sportsman. He loves horses and spends much of the time at the track watching the races. He is currently a Director Emeritus for Hollywood Park, one of the world's leading racetracks.

All of his achievements pale, in comparison to what Mickey considers his greatest life achievement. That is Mickey's over 20year marriage to Jan (Chamberlin) Rooney. A stellar talent in her own right, Jan is a multi-faceted Singer, Actress, Songwriter and Abstract Artist. Mickey finds his most fulfilling moments when he performs "Two For The Show" with Jan and has the opportunity to enjoy her talents with an audience. They remain deeply in love with one another. They currently reside in Westlake Village, California. There they enjoy the pleasure and quiet of the country with the other loves of their lives, their three birds and three dogs. They are both strong Animal Rights Advocates.







Jan Chamberlin Rooney

Jan began singing in church choirs. Her career has included concerts, T.V., commercials, voice-overs and radio. A big turning point in her life occurred when she met Mickey. They share a love of music, theater and animals.

Jan and Mickey have worked on many proects together. Among the numerous songs in her repertoire are songs she has composed.

Jan has two sons and nine stepchildren. She lives outside L.A., in Westlake Village with her husband and their six animals.





The World Premiere of Septime Webre's Romeo and Juliet was performed by American Repertory Ballet on January 17, 1996 at McCarter Theatre in Princeton.

William Shakespeare wrote his tragedy Romeo and Juliet, one of his most compelling and enduring plays, sometime between 1594 and 1596. In 1935, more than three centuries later, the composer Sergei Prokofiev submitted his new score for the ballet Romeo and Juliet to the Bolshoi's directorate in Moscow. Controversy erupted, because Prokofiev had changed Shakespeare's tragic ending to a happy one, arguing, with understandable logic that "living people can dance, the dying cannot." Prokofiev agreed to restore the fatal outcome, but then the Bolshoi found the score "unsuitable for dancing." As a result, Romeo and Juliet had its first performance on December 30, 1938, not in the USSR, but in Brno, Czechoslovakia. For its Soviet premiere in January 1940 at the Kirov in Leningrad, the composer made significant alterations to the score. It was an immediate hit and has been re-choreographed by various choreographers throughout this century.

Septime Webre, (choreographer) joined The Washington Ballet this season as artistic director after a successful six-year term as artistic director of American Repertory Ballet, following several years as resident choreographer. While there, Mr. Webre staged more than 17 works for the company including Romeo and Juliet and Swan Lake, a highly successful collaboration with Maurice Sendak on his book Where the Wild Things Are; and Carmina Burana. Today, Mr. Webre's works are performed by Pacific Northwest Ballet, Les Grand Ballet Canadiens, North Carolina Dance Theatre, Dayton Ballet, Ballet Austin, Eglevsky Ballet, Aspen Ballet, Sacramento Ballet and the Washington Ballet. Listed in Who's Who in America, Who's Who in Entertainment in America, and Outstanding Young Men in America, Mr. Webre has served on NEA selection panels, and received a fellowship for choreography from the New Jersey State Council on the Arts/Department of State.

ACT I

Scene I: A Square in Verona

In Verona's main square at daybreak, young Romeo, son of Montague, broods, swimming in emotions he does not quite understand. He reaches out for something unrecognizable with both expectation and foreboding.

As Verona's main piazza comes alive, Romeo's friends Mercutio and Benvolio try to rid Romeo of his melancholy mood. Tybalt, nephew of Capulet, comes across Romeo and resumes the longstanding feud between the Capulets and the Montagues. When Archduke Cardinal, Prince of Verona, orders an end to the fighting, the two sides submit to a reluctant peace.

Scenes II-IV: The House of Capulet

Juliet, the young daughter of Capulet, teases her nurse as Lord and Lady Capulet arrive with Paris, a Count, who asks the reluctant girl to marry him.

That evening at a ball at the Capulet palazzo, Romeo, Mercutio and Benvolio enter in disguise. Juliet and Romeo discover each other among the multitude of guests and fall in love. Tybalt recognizes Romeo as a Montague and wishes to enter in battle but is thwarted by Lord Capulet, who will not disparage Romeo in his own house.

Scene V: The Balcony

"With love's light wings did I o'erperch these walls, For stony limits cannot hold love"

Juliet lingers on her memories of Romeo when, to her unexpected delight, Romeo appears below. They declare their love for each other.

Scene I: A Square in Verona

As merrymakers celebrate the Feast of Åll Souls, known as the "day of the dead," Juliet's nurse makes her way with a message for Romeo. Juliet will marry him secretly in Friar Laurence's chapel that day.

Scene II: Friar Laurence's Chapel

"So smile the heavens upon this holy act"

Friar Laurence marries Romeo & Juliet.

Scene III: A Square in Verona

"And if we meet, we shall not escape a brawl, For now, these hot days, is the mad blood stirring"

The revelry continues as Tybalt emerges from the crowd, drawing his sword at Mercutio. Romeo, now a kinsman of Tybalt's, tries in vain to stop the fight; Tybalt kills Mercutio. Enraged at the death of his friend, Romeo kills Tybalt and is banished from Verona forever.

ACT III

Scene I: Juliet's Bedchamber

"More light and light – more dark and dark over woes!"

The newlyweds awaken and spend a moment together before Romeo must leave. The Capulets arrive with Paris. Against Juliet's protestation, they have decided Juliet must marry Paris as soon as possible. In despair, Juliet runs to Friar Laurence for help.

Scene II: Friar Laurence's Chapel

"Come weep with me – past hope, past cure, past help!"

Friar Laurence gives Juliet a poison that will make her appear dead. After the funeral, she will be reunited with Romeo and they will flee Verona together.

Scene III: Juliet's Bedchamber

Returning home, the contrite Juliet agrees to marry Paris. When left alone, Juliet reaches for the poison and drinks it.

Amid the wedding preparation, Juliet is found, seemingly dead.

Scene IV: The Capulet Family Tomb

"Let me have a dram of poison such soon – speeding gear As will disperse itself through the veins That the life-weary taker may fall dead."

Juliet is buried. As the mourners leave, Romeo enters the crypt and encounters Paris. They struggle and Paris is mortally wounded. Believing Juliet to be dead, Romeo drinks poison and dies. Juliet awakens from sleep and finds Romeo, her beloved. She stabs herself and joins Romeo in death.

"For never was a story of more woe than this of Juliet and her Romeo."


