## WHO'S WHO...

TOM CREGAN (Irish Tenor) studied singing at The College of Music Dublin and The London College of Music. He has worked extensively as a soloist in Ireland performing in opera, oratorio and has given many solo recitals. Tom has performed in mainland Europe, Australia and Japan.

He appeared as a principal singer with the Royal Opera, Covent Garden for seven years, singing solo roles in Fidelio and Death in Venice. Following this he sang solo parts in Mozart's Belmonte with Court Opera, Vecchi's L'amfiparnasso on a British, European, and Australian tour, Solome with Folkopera at the Edinburgh Festival in Scotland and Carmen with Co-Opera. Tom sang the role of The Lawyer in the EMI recording of Britten's Peter Grimes. He has also made many appearances on RTE, Irelands national radio and television station.

Since his return to Ireland he has worked as a principal singer for Opera Ireland, Co-Opera, RTE and The Opera Theatre Company. He currently sings with The National Chamber Choir. As a member of The Tenors he has just completed a tour of Ireland with their show Celtic Journey to great acclaim.

CIARAN NAGLE (Irish Tenor) Ciaran's love of music started during his school days. He trained at the College of Music in Dublin. During his time there he sang many tenor roles including Aeneas in Dido and Aeneas, Kaspar in Amahl and The Night Visitors to name but a few. For three years Ciaran sang with The National Chamber Choir, Ireland's only professional choir. He has performed many tenor roles to date, including Guiseppe in La Traviata with Lyric Opera Company and El Remendada in Carmen, a Bernadette Greavy production at The National Concert Hall in Dublin.


He has also sung with Opera Ireland in their productions of La Cenerentole, Faust, Tosca, The Magic Flute, La Boheme, L'elisir D'amour, Eugene Onegin, Macbeth, Falstaff and The Tales of Hoffman. Ciaran has performed a comprehensive range of Oratorio roles both in Ireland and abroad. In 1999 Ciaran performed in Creation and the Seasons at New York's Carnegie Hall.

In addition to his roles in opera, Ciaran has performed many roles in musicals including Ralph in HMS Pinafore and Cascade in The Merry Widow. More recently, Ciaran has been noted for his performance in Riverdance The Show, touring with the company for a year and a half throughout Europe and Japan. As a member of The Tenors he has just finished a tour of Ireland with their show Celtic Journey to great acclaim.

ANTHONY NORTON (Irish Tenor) Anthony started his training in The Royal Northern College of Music in Manchester. He then moved to London where he studied piano, conducting and voice at Trinity College London. Since his graduation his career has taken him to international acclaim. He started his operatic career as a chorister with Scottish Opera and progressed to a principal singer with them. He then moved to Italy where he became a member of the world famous La Scala Opera Company. He made his debut as a soloist with La Scala in Weber's Oberon. Anthony sang principle roles with them for five years. During this time he made numerous appearances in opera houses and festivals throughout Europe, and toured as a soloist in Europe and Japan.

Since his return to Ireland he has been one of the most sought after tenors, singing opera, oratorio, and concert work. He has worked with Opera Ireland, The Wexford

Festival of Opera, The Opera Theatre Company, and The National Symphony Orchestra of Ireland. As a director Anthony has worked as Assistant Director for Opera Ireland and The Opera Machine and is Artistic Director of the Dublin based Drawing Room Opera. As a member of The Tenors he has just completed a tour of Ireland with their show *The Celtic Journey* to great acclaim.

JACQUELINE WHELAN (Soprano and Harpist) Jacqueline is one of Ireland's leading sopranos. She has starred in both the Doyles Irish Cabaret, at the Burlington Hotel and the famous Jury's Irish Cabaret. While with Jury's she toured extensively in the USA, having appeared in such prestigious venues as Carnegie Hall, The Kennedy Center, the Boston Symphony Hall and The Ambassador Auditorium in Pasadena.

Jacqueline started her singing career at the age of fifteen, winning a scholarship to the Municipal College of Music. In 1979 she won three major competitions in Ireland: The Soprano Gold Medal, The Thomas Moore Cup and The Margaret Burke-Sheridan for best female voice at The Dublin Feis Ceoil. In 1980 she received a Teaching Diploma from the Royal Academy of Music. From 1982 to 1985 Jacqueline studied at The Guildhall School of Music and Drama, London, where she completed a Postgraduate Course in Advanced Singing. While in London she took part in such festivals as The Cambridge Arts Festival, and The City of London Festival. After returning to Ireland she gave a number of recitals, one of which was at the Kilkenny Arts Festival and another at The National Concert Hall in Dublin.

She has appeared on television both at home and abroad. She has played many leading roles in such musi-

cals as The Whitehorse Inn, A Little Night Music, Oklahoma, The Gondoliers, Showboat, and Fiddler On The Roof.

JIMMY KENNEDY (Comedian and Storyteller) Dublin born Jimmy Kennedy, Singer, Comedian, and Seanchái has been entertaining from the early age of fourteen, after winning a talent competition at Dublin's Queens Theatre. Since then he has played in concerts, variety shows, musicals, and pantomimes in many parts of the world including the USA and Canada. Jimmy has performed on cruise ships to Bermuda, The Caribbean and Alaska and in the company of such names as The Irish Rovers, Dame Vera Lynn, Paddy Noonan and Noel Henry. He has also recorded a number of record albums including Innisfree, Green Isle, Sounds of Ireland, and A Little Bit of Irish.

NOLEEN COSGROVE (Fiddle Player) Noleen began playing violin at the age of four. Starting with classical music she played in various youth orchestras in her local town of Derry. As she approached her teens she began playing with a traditional Irish band. In 1994, Noleen moved to Dublin to study at Trinity College. While there she played at many traditional Irish music sessions sthroughout the City, and was also featured in the college orchestra. She spent two summer seasons at Mosney Holiday Centre where she was a featured soloist in their cabaret show. For the last three years she has toured extensively throughout Europe and The United States of America as the lead violinist with the famous Miami Showband, for which she received great acclaim.

NIALL McCLEAN (Fiddle Player) Niall began studying the Violin at the age of eight. He comes from a very musical family, his father is a renowned Traditional Irish Music Fiddle Player and his mother is a music teacher. He studied classical music in Belfast and achieved honours in every grade. He has played throughout Ireland and Europe with his family band The McClean Traditional Irish Band. Niall is a very sought after session musician, having played on many recordings for both the BBC and RTE national radio and television stations in Northern and Southern Ireland. Niall has held the title Ulster Champion Fiddler on no fewer than four occasions.

JIM WHITE (Dance Captain/Dancer) Jim's musical credits include productions of The Sound of Music, The Merry Widow, Follies, Me and My Girl and Andrew Lloyd Webber's Aspects of Love. Television and Film work includes The Late Late Show, The Sandy Kelly Show, Finbars Class, Widows Peak, Circle of Friends and Neil Jordan's The Butcher Boy. He has performed with Cois Ceim Dance Theatre in Temporary Arrangements and Red Luck, which toured to The Edinburgh and The Spring Loaded Dance Festival in London. In 1998 Jim appeared at The Melbourne Festival in Australia, with The Abbey Theatre's production of The Secret Fall of Constance Wilde. Following his return to Dublin he appeared in the Christmas Pantomime at The Olympia Theatre. In the summer of 1999 Jim appeared alongside The Three Irish Tenors at Clontarf Castle Hotel, Dublin. In March 2000 Jim toured for the first time in the United States in A Feast of Irish Music & Dance.

KENNETH FARRELLY (Dancer) Kenneth trained at the Helen Jordan Stage School. He made his first professional appearance at The Olympia Theatre in Robinson Crusoe. He has performed at The Point Theatre, The National Concert Hall, The Rupert Guinness Theatre and Waterford's Theatre Royal. He has appeared in pop videos and Irish Dance videos. He is in great demand throughout Ireland and was featured this Christmas in The Olympia Theatre Pantomime as the lead male Irish Dancer. Kenneth has worked for Irish Ferries as their lead Irish Dancer as part of their Normandy Ferry Summer Cabaret. In March 2000 he performed in the United States in the touring production A Feast of Irish Music & Dance. Upon his return to Ireland he once again took part in the Normandy Ferry Summer Cabaret. He is looking forward to his second tour in The United States performing along side The Three Irish Tenors.

CAITRIONA FLYNN (Dancer) Caitriona has been dancing from the age of six. She began dancing with the Mountaine School of Irish Dancing with whom she rose to the level of All Ireland Dance Champion. She has toured Ireland performing in Riverdance Shows in many venues. She has also travelled as far as New York and New Jersey dancing in their world famous St. Patrick's Day Parade. Caitriona has also been performing for several years with Diggs Lane's Brendan Scully studying Hip-Hop and Disco Dancing. She has danced in many shows including 2FM'S Beat on the Street, along with Billie, B\*witched, T-Spoon and Men2b. She also has much singing experience including two performances on Network 2's TX programme.

In 1999 she appeared in a six-month season, along side The Three Irish Tenors, at Clontarf Castle Hotel, Dublin. Once again she has been chosen to perform at the Olympia Theatre with Twink and Dustin in their Christmas Pantomime. In March 2000 Caitriona performed in A Feast of Irish Music & Dance throughout the United States. Upon her return to Dublin she was booked to perform in an Irish revue show for Irish Ferries travelling between France and Ireland from May to October. Caitriona is looking forward to returning to tour in both productions Christmas from Dublin and The


Three Irish Tenors in the United States. In the future Caitriona will be appearing at Clontarf Castle in the 2001 summer production.

CARLA POWER (Dancer) A successful sixteen-year-old competitive Feis Dancer who started her dancing career at the age of three with The Cora Cadwell School of Irish Dancing in Dublin, she has been a member of the famous Jury's Irish Cabaret. She more recently completed a sixmonth season with The Three Irish Tenors at Clontarf Castle Hotel in Dublin. Carla has travelled extensively in the last two years performing in major concert venues in France, Portugal, Austria and the United States. In the United States she has performed in Branson, Missouri and at The Beacon Resort, New Hampshire. Also an accomplished traditional musician, she hopes eventually to pursue a career in teaching dance and music. This will be Carla's second tour of the United States with John Heron & Associates Inc.

SIOBHAN O'CONNOR (Dancer) Siobhan began dancing at the age of three with the Cora Cadwell School of Irish Dancing. She performed her first professional engagement at the age of ten in an Irish Cabaret Show at the Shieling Hotel, Dublin. This was followed by another show at the Regency Hotel, Dublin. In 1999 Siobhan was a featured Irish Dancer in The Contarf Castle Summer Show appearing along side The Three Irish Tenors. She also appeared with The Three Irish Tenors at the world famous Rose of Tralee Festival. Earlier this year she was the lead dancer in a piece specially commissioned at The Royal Hospital Kilmainham with The R.T.E. Concert Orchestra. Siobhan is no stranger to theatre having appeared at The Olympia Theatre in Dublin. She has also had the pleasure of dancing for the President of Ireland. Siobhan recorded her first demo tape this year. She was a member of the winning Cora Cadwell team at this year's All Ireland Championships.

DAVID HAYES (Musical Supervisor) David Hayes is without doubt one of the leading musical directors that the Emerald Isle has to offer. A graduate of the Royal Irish Academy of Music he is in constant demand as a musical director, arranger and producer in Ireland as well as in Europe. He has been musical director for many of the world's most famous musicals, television spectaculars, and theatrical masterpieces. From opera to variety David is at home with all of them. David's most successful musical project to date was his five-year run as the original musical director for the world famous Riverdance Dance Show. Last year was his second year as musical director for A Feast of Irish Music & Dance. He is presently musical associate for the record breaking summer dinner theatre show at Dublin's recently refurbished Clontarf Castle Hotel, starring The Three Irish Tenors.

DAVID WRAY (Musical Director) David Wray trained at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, London working with singers in all forms of musical theatre. He has since worked in Opera and Music Theatre and has accompanied a number of distinguished soloists in concerts and recordings. David was assistant to the director of The English Bach Festival for three years with whom he appeared at the Royal Opera House at Covent Gardens and throughout Europe. For this company he was musical director for two productions: Dido and Aeneas (London) and Acis and Galatea (London and Barcelona). David has lived in Ireland since 1991 and has worked with major opera companies (D.G.O.S. and Wexford Festival Opera). He formed the Leinster Opera studio with Dr. Veronica Dunne and the director Michael Scott with whom he has toured extensively in Ireland and also works as

vocal coach and accompanist at the Leinster School of Music. He is director of the *Veronica Dunne International Singing Competition* that took place again in January 1999.

David works regularly for R.T.E. in both television and radio and has worked extensively in Irish theatre. As a keyboard player credits include Follies in Concert at the National Concert Hall, The Risen People (Gaiety), Carmen (National Concert Hall) with Bernadette Greevy, Don Pasquale (R.T.E.), The Pirates of Penzance, The King & I and Me and My Girl all at the Olympia Theatre. David recently worked on Tarry Flynn (Abbey Theatre) as singing coach and arranger and was Musical Associate for the production of Andrew Lloyd Webber's Aspects of Love (Olympia Theatre/Cork Opera House). He also worked as Musical Associate on the production of Rockinson Crusoe and Puss in Boots at the Olympia Theatre with Dustin and Twink.

He was Musical director of The Rocky Horror Show (Tivoli/Olympia), Side by Side by Sondheim (Temple Bar Music Centre), Just Bodies for Irish Modern Dance Theatre for which he also devised the music, the Hot Mikado (Olympia Theatre), Rockin' Hood (Olympia Theatre), Red Hot & Cole and Kander and Ebb's The World Goes Round for Music Theatre Ireland at the National Concert Hall, a traditional Irish show, Shamrock and Shillelaghs, on tour in the U.S.A. Recently David has been Musical Director for a series of programmes for R.T.E.'s Theatre Nights including a special centenary concert celebrating the music of Noel Coward at the National Concert Hall and most recently two programmes of the music of Gilbert and Sullivan and Ivor Novello. David has just completed a run as musical director of a new musical play A Chelsea Affair at the Theatre Space, Dublin based on the life of Oscar Wilde and starring Adele King. He is currently Musical Director for 'The Tenors', with whom he is on a national tour. In August, he will be musical director for Daylight Opera, a new project being promoted by Dublin Corporation.

BOB DURKIN (Production Supervisor) Mr. Durkin's work, as a Director-Choreographer, has been represented Off-Broadway, in stock, regional, national, and international touring companies. National and international touring shows he has directed and choreographed include: Hello, Dolly!, Dreamgirls, The Goodbye Girl, They're Playing Our Song, Anything Goes, Ain't Misbehavin', Purlie, Little Shop of Horrors, One Mo' Time, Nunsense II, and Seven Brides for Seven Brothers. He was the recipient of the 1997 Connecticut Critic's Circle Award for outstanding Choreography of a musical for his work on the national tour of Seven Brides for Seven Brothers. In 1998, Bob served as Associate Choreographer to Tommy Tune on the pre-Broadway workshop of Irving Berlin's Easter Parade starring Tommy Tune and Sandy Duncan both in Sydney, Australia and in New York City. During the past twenty-five years, audiences in virtually every hemisphere have seen Bob's work. Shows that he has directed and choreographed have played to audiences in Austria, Australia, Finland, Italy, Portugal, Brazil, Spain, Columbia, Singapore, Malaysia, Hong Kong, China, Canada, and throughout the United States.

BELINDA MURPHY (Irish Dance Choreographer) Dublin born Belinda completed three years of professional training at the College of Dance and furthered her studies at the Las Vegas School of Dance, Nevada. While studying in Vegas, Belinda appeared with Brendan Bowyer in The Irish Showband in Caesar's Palace, The Mirage and the Stardust. She has been involved in many theatre productions and cabarets in Ireland and has toured extensively in the United States. Among her credits are West Side Story, Jury's Irish Cabaret and Riverdance of which she was the original Assistant Choreographer and also performed in. Belinda has

appeared at the Royal Command Performance in London in front of His Highness The Prince of Wales, choreographed Buskin at The Tivoli Theatre, Sleeping Beauty Sort Of at Dublin's Point Theatre (the birthplace of Riverdance). Included in her choreography credits are Rockinson Crusoe at the Olympia, Knightime at the Castle starring The Three Irish Tenors, and a Summer Spectacular at Clontarf Castle, Dublin. One of the high points of her career to date was last Christmas when she choreographed a production of Handel's Messiah at the RSD Arena in Dublin.

IOE CONLAN (Director) Joe Conlan has been one of Ireland's leading actors, singers and dancers since joining the entertainment profession over twenty years ago. He started his career with the Bill Barry Stage School at the age of eight and since then has matured into one of the finest all around entertainers to come out of the Emerald Isle. He has starred in many stage musicals including George M, Singing in the Rain, Annie Get Your Gun, Guys and Dolls, and The Mikado; plays such as The Boistal Boy; and many concerts with the R.T.E. Concert Orchestra, to the best of critical acclaim. He has performed throughout the United States and Canada. More recently he has moved into directing. He directed the famous Doyles Irish Cabaret at the Burlington Hotel, *The New Viking* Feast for Dublin Tourism, and the Irish Cabaret at The Europa Hotel, Belfast. He also directed Knighttime at the Castle, at Clontarf Castle Hotel, Dublin, which featured The Three Irish Tenors and Rebecca Storm.

For the last several years he has toured the United States as both a performer and Artistic Director with A Feast of Irish Music & Dance. Joe will be returning to the Beacon Resort Hotel, New Hampshire, as the star of Shamrocks & Shillelaghs in March, 2001.

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#### A GLOSSARY OF IRISH TERMS

#### The Wren Boys

The Wren Boys originated in Celtic, prehistoric times. They appeared in mid-winter, the bad, dark time of year; the lowest, leanest time of the year. Their purpose was to ensure human fertility and agricultural survival. They also brought a dimension of luck to the climate of courtship. The Wren Boys encourage feelings of community with entertainment beyond tribal divisions, personality differences, geographic isolation, and differing beliefs, both political and religious. As entertainment, it is a harmless, happy interaction.

They wear The Wren Boy's masks to hide their identity, so they themselves might mingle freely, fostering entertainment and a party-like atmosphere. They bring social and mental healing, and interaction which revitalizes all. They bring the Christmas spirit to each house, and their closing wish is for a year of good luck and happiness.

#### The Seancahie

In the Irish countryside the traditional storyteller was know as the Seanachie. Many of his stories were handed down from father to son; others were based on happenings around him. In the long winter evenings he sat at the peat fire and told his stories to those who came to listen.

In those days there was no radio, television or electric light in the home. In the glow of the peat fire and the soft candlelight, the evening passed pleasantly with stories, song and dance.

The Hurley

Hurling dates from pre-Christian times and was played by teams of warriors for day on end. Hurling is a fast game played with an ash stick or "hurley" from thirty to thirty seven inches long, with a striking end curved broadly, rather like a hockey stick. This is used to hit, or carry, a leather ball known as a "sliotar" (slitter) which is smaller than a cricket ball and weighs between three and a half and four and a half ounces. The sliotar can be driven along the ground or slung over the players head. The game is played by two teams of fifteen who score by striking the sliotar into the opponent's goal.

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
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
