Director's note -

A life street, winding down memory lane. On it sits an old apartment building, destined to be torn down. Once vibrant - now dilapidated, an eyesore. It once served as an intimate dwelling for hundreds of people. It now stands forgotten, or almost. Nine former inhabitants reunite to see it one last time. Nine people who grew up together, fought together, loved and dreamed together. They come to reexperience their youth and spirit that once painted the walls and the music that carpeted the floors.

When you hear a song of Lieber and Stoller it more than likely stirs a memory. Sitting on the stoop in front of your house talking with the guys, trying to work up the courage to ask a girl to dance at your first "hop," or maybe stealing your first kiss watching the "B" movie at the drive-in. Their songs evoke an emotion as well as an era; they have become part of our culture as well as our heritage. When approaching the show I wanted to do more than just present the songs the way you'd see them on a TV special or retrospect. I wanted to give them an emotional context as well. To create the place where these songs live. It is to this place we go...a place both imagined and real... an apartment building where nine kids grew up listening, dancing, making out, rebelling, and just hanging out to the music of Leiber and Stoller.

Musical Director – William Foster McDaniel

Mokey Joe's Café's Musical Director, William Foster McDaniel, has been a musician all his life; his mother learned he could play the piano after she lost him on a shopping trip, and found the five year old happily playing "America The Beautiful" at the back of the store. "I eventually got my Master's in music at Boston University, I wanted to be a concert pianist. Then I was a Fulbright Scholar for a year in Paris, one of the most wonderful experiences of my life," McDaniel said.

This will be McDaniel's tenth show at Gateway, his first was Ain't Misbehavin' in 1991, his favorite show which he had played for 15 years on tour. "I never set out to be in musical theater," McDaniel explains, "my nextdoor neighbor in my apartment building had heard me practicing, and came over to ask if I was interested in subbing for him for two weeks in The Fantasticks in New York. Those two weeks ended up being six years." McDaniel decided that musical theater was suited to him. because he could easily play different styles of music. One job led to another, including national tours of Bubbling Brown Sugar, Timbuktu (which starred Eartha Kitt) and Ain't Misbehavin'.


Being Musical Director for a show poses its own challenges. "When a producer hires a team, the Director, Choreographer, Casting Director and Musical Director all work together to cast the show," McDaniel explained, "Once the cast is assembled I am responsible for teaching all the music and conveying how it is to be interpreted. First I like to read through the score at the piano, I listen to the CD, and if I haven't seen the show I go to Lincoln Center Library and watch it on video. I am responsible for all the music in rehearsal, often being the rehearsal pianist or supervising that person, and working closely with the Director, which sometimes involves arranging the music. In a new show, the music is evolving every day, and I work closely with the composer to make sure his desires are met. Once the show is ready, I take over the direction of the orchestra, sometimes I am involved in hiring the musicians. I rehearse them, then conduct the show during the run. When the show is open, I have continued responsibility for any musical tasks involving cast replacements, maintaining the integrity of the musical demands of the show, etc. Most people are not aware that in a long running show, especially on Broadway, on any given night 60% of the pit is made up of substitute musicians. It is my job to help the musicians who don't know the show get through it and make everything sound the same, night after night, even though the personnel is different."


When he isn't involved in the production of a musical, McDaniel works as an arranger, and performs classical concerts as a pianist or conductor or composer - sometimes all three. "It's all good," he said. "Each one has its own particular thrill. Touring can be a lot of fun, I've seen a great deal of the world, which is one of the best things about being a performer."

Many of the performers on Gateway's stage are members of Actors Equity Association, which is the union for American theatrical actors and stage managers, the same union covering Broadway and Off-Broadway performers.

Gateway runs a successful set rental business and often buys sets from Broadway or National Tours. This year, part of Jekyll & Hyde's set was acquired from Broadway, and Footloose will feature the National Tour set. When Gateway creates a new set, it is often orchestrated by lighting and set designers
