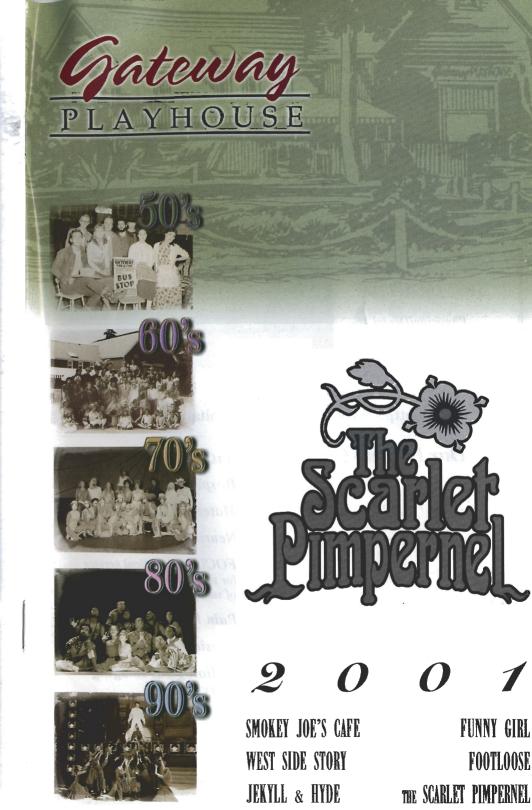

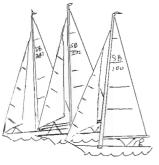

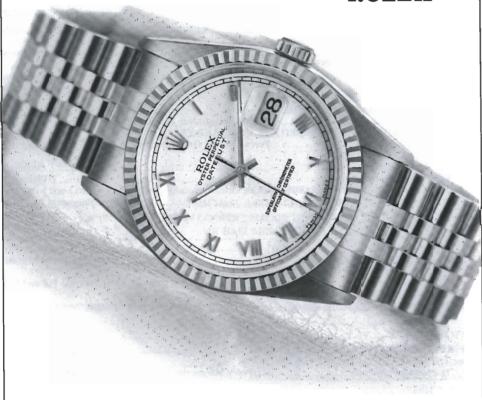

### FEATURED PERFORMERS...

### EILEEN KADEN AND BRADLEY DEAN

I ileen and Bradley met in college, but it took another ten years for them to fall in love and get married. Eileen began her career as a dancer, performing in a dance company and taking lessons at the Joffrey Ballet throughout junior and senior high school. When a performing arts high school opened, she spent her last two years there. "They recommended me and I got in as a Governor's Scholar. It's a scholarship program for the arts, you go to state college for a month, and that's when I realized I have to do this for a living. Then they advised me to apply to Carnegie-

Mellon, where I became an acting major." Bradley was born in a small town in Pennsylvania and his mother would drive him an hour away to Allentown so he could do shows. "We had a Governor's School, too, and they also recommended I go to Carnegie-Mellon," he said. "We met briefly, I was two years above him," said Eileen, "but you are so busy you pretty much don't know any-body outside your class."

The couple met up again when Eileen was auditioning for the European tour of *The* 

Rocky Horror Show. "A friend of mine from college said, 'isn't that the show Bradley Dean is doing?' When I went in for the audition he was there, and we had a sort of 'I remember you' moment," Eileen said. They toured throughout Europe for six months doing one-nighters, she playing Janet, he playing Frank N. Furter. "What a place to date! Our first date was in Rome. Then it was my first Christmas away from my family, but I knew he was the one because I didn't care," said Eileen, who planned a lot of their wedding while appearing last summer in Gateway's production of Big. Bradley then got

his first Broadway show, *Jane Eyre*, and the couple spent three weeks waiting to see if the wedding date would have to be moved. "Luckily, they gave me two days off," said Bradley, "and another day as a surprise."

Bradley and Eileen have been fortunate to work together often. He left *Jane Eyre* to do *No Way To Treat A Lady* with her in Connecticut, and they performed together again in Dallas in *The Tempest*. "I don't usually play the romantic lead," said Bradley, "and I always seem to be cast as someone trying to kill her!" It's a refreshing change for the newly-

weds to be playing newly-weds in *The Scarlet Pimpernel*. "We hadn't gotten to do many scenes together in the other shows, now we get to sing love songs to each other," said Eileen. "It saves you a lot of trouble acting," added Bradley, "you just sort of be, it's great."

As much as she loves acting, Eileen is prepared to give it up once children come into their lives. "It doesn't mean as much to me as it does to him. I love it, but not at the expense of having a life," she

said,"I have been looking into becoming a wedding coordinator, or something I can do so that I can have the freedom to visit him if he is gone six weeks in a show. I just think he's great and I want to spend time with him and have our family together." Bradley joked, "Whenever she thinks about really doing it, she gets an acting job! They won't let her out." Eileen remains philosophical. "Right now it is wonderful, we get to be here together and we get to be working. And if that changes, it would be because we had a baby, and *that* would be wonderful. It's a win-win situation, no matter what."

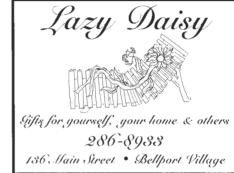

### Spotlight On...

### FIGHT CHOREOGRAPHY

ight Choreographer Rob McKindles developed his skills in stage fighting out of necessity - it seemed all the acting roles he was getting required him to punch, shoot, or stab somebody. When working on a show with someone who was trained in theatrical fighting techniques, he expressed an interest in learning more. "We traded services; I taught him to play guitar and he taught me stage combat," he said.

McKindles' biggest challenge was when he became Fight Captain for *The Scarlet Pimpernel* on Broadway under Fight Choreographer Rick Sordelet. "I learned the most from him. I really watched how he built a fight around the actors' personalities and physical attributes. I'd never

been a Fight Captain at that level before, and it was a huge responsibility." A Fight Captain is similar to a Dance Captain in that both maintain the choreographer's vision during the run of the show. A Fight Captain, however, is operating in the world of fistfights and weaponry, and safety becomes his top concern.

Reproduction swords, like those for sale at medieval stores and in home décor catalogs, are not "battle ready" and cannot be used on stage. Fencing weapons are also inappropriate. "We use a sword made of carbon steel so they can take a little beating, because we do make contact. These swords are made specifically for stage purposes, but even though they are not sharpened, that point will still hurt and you could cut somebody," McKindles explained, "You never want to choreograph a fight beyond somebody's ability. I think

you have to allow the actor to help you decide what works for both of you, in terms of his skill and the needs of the show." When choreograph-

ing a fight, McKindles finds it important to use what he learned from Sordelet - base the fight on the actor's physical attributes and his interpretation of the character he plays. "For example, in this show, Percy has to be able to stand his ground, but it's not like he's trained all his life to sword fight. He's a gentleman and a philanthropist, he's sort of like Bruce Wayne, and he's a little nutty. On the other hand, 1 think Chauvelin wanted to improve his stock as a soldier, and trained. 1 want

to build a fight where Percy can defend himself, he's very smart and very quick, but he's not a Chauvelin when it comes to sword fighting," he said.

When rehearsing for Broadway, McKindles had three weeks before show rehearsals began just to rehearse the fighting. At Gateway, there

are only two weeks total rehearsal period for all aspects of the show. "It's a great challenge for me to teach two people how to sword fight in two weeks, plus put together a four-and-a-half-minute fight," said McKindles, "I think of the weapon as another character in the play, and you have to treat it with that respect. No one pulls out a sword or gun on stage for no reason. It is there because it could ultimately change the course of your story."

Before each performance there is a "fight call" when McKindles determines the mood and physical condition that day of the actors involved in the fight scenes. "I ask how everyone is doing because you don't want them bringing a personal issue to the stage. It makes their fight heavy and sloppy and the other actor will wonder why this person is taking out their aggression on him," he explained.

The actors walk a fine line when fighting, as they must seem believable to the audience, yet they cannot be too forceful with each other or someone will get hurt. "You have to get the actor to the point where he *looks* like he's out of control," said McKindles, "but inside he must be in *complete* control. He has to be in the moment all the time."

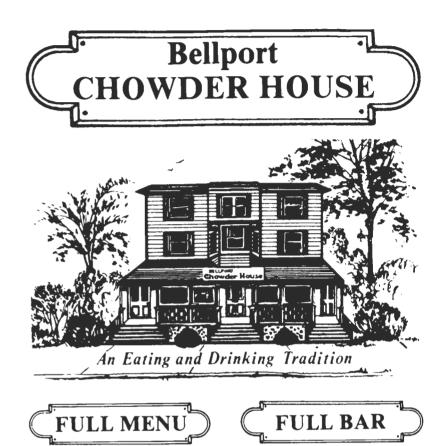

### Performing Arts Training -

### GATEWAY ACTING SCHOOL'S NINTH YEAR

hen Robin Joy Allan moved back to the east coast, after casting feature films and television MOW's and series for five years, she was compelled to create a professional training ground for Long Island youngsters. "I absolutely loved the casting process and working with people such as Ron Howard, Rob Reiner, Chris Carter etc...but the thing that turned me on the most was the "one on one" with the actor in the pre-screening process. I was able to take the initial instincts of the actor/actress and guide them in the right direction so that they were right on target for their call back. This was especially rewarding with the kids who auditioned." Robin should know, she cast all the children in the hit mowie PARENTHOOD and the subsequent series, where Leonardo DiCaprio got his first big break. Robin says he was adorable at his first audition and had incredible charm and believability in his reading, but the complete wrong take on the role. "He probably had not read the script and was just flying by the seat of his pants for the audition." She coached him and eventually brought him in for Ron Howard. "The network (NBC) loved him, although Tobey Maguire was also in the running, and was my personal favorite for the role. But you see, he eventually got where he was supposed to be too. In this business, if you're talented and hang in there, eventually you'll work....perhaps stardom is not in the cards, but you'll work. There is enough work out there, especially on the west coast, contrary to outdated beliefs about starving actors." Ms. Allan has brought her knowledge and expertise out to Long Island and has brought Gateway's Acting School Division to its ninth successful year. "It's a whole different ball game out here", says Robin, "kids and parents are not career oriented. They don't have any idea of the scope of the business, and what it takes to compete in the

professional arena. Kids play leads in their school shows and feel this is what "experience" is. With few exceptions, the directors are either English or Music teachers who are not versed in the field, they are trying to do a tough job of herding forty or fifty kids into a production that the school can be proud of, but have little time to teach acting technique. The way the performing arts are taught in the schools needs reform. A structure is there for the fine arts and sports, why not Acting? For excellence, there needs to be a structured training process, daily exercises and lessons." Until that time, she hopes her school will fill the gap. She offers classes in all levels of Acting, Musical Theater and a Monologue Study Class for High School Seniors vying for College BFA slots. She has seen the growth of the students in the school over the last several years, long time students are accepted to the most competitive colleges and universities, some winning scholarships, some are in New York and Los Angeles at this time, successfully competing in the arena they were trained for "We can't brag about propelling a superstar yet," Robin says with a laugh, "but one day, we may!"

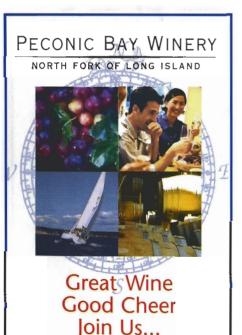

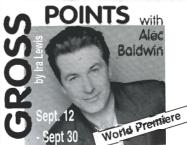

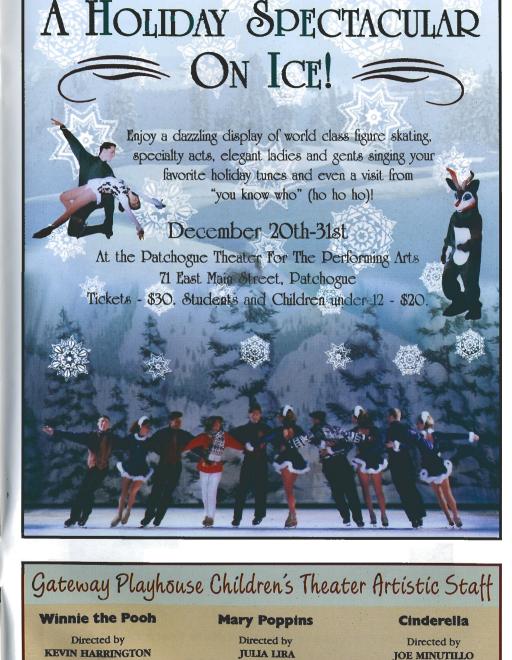
