

A LETTER FROM THE PRODUCER

Theater technology is continually evolving, and audiences' expectations have increased as a result. As Long Island's only professional musical theater, we endeavor to keep up with the latest developments in staging, sound, and lighting to bring our patrons an incredible theatrical experience they won't find anywhere else.

For Jesus Christ Superstar, since we have re-thought the presentation of this show and set it in a future time - we had the opportunity to create an original environment making use of a turntable, trussing, and unique scenic materials such as expanded polystyrene - an industrial foam used to carve some of the set pieces. We make use of "intelligent" fixtures (moving lights,) theatrical haze, gobo (projected pattern) rotators, color changers, and other computer-controlled effects. The audio department has been busy making adjustments - as sound reinforcement has always been a challenge at the Patchogue Theatre. For Superstar we have brought in additional speakers, processors, and amplifiers to better distribute the sound, and placed the live band backstage in an enclosed room. This will give our sound operator complete isolated control of the entire show from a state of the art mixing console.

In December, we will once again construct an indoor skating rink by freezing 18,000 lbs. of water on stage to create the skating surface for *The Nutcracker on Ice*. The Moscow troupe is in rehearsal now preparing the World Premiere of this lavish spectacular. Tickets will go on sale in mid September.

Our slogan is "Broadway in Your Backyard" and we constantly strive to live up to those words. It is our pleasure and privilege to present shows with extremely high production values, and we will continue to challenge ourselves and our audiences with cutting-edge entertainment.

Director's Note...

Often we hear the question raised, "how would we encounter Jesus Christ if he walked into the world today?" In this production of Jesus Christ Superstar we have chosen to explore that possibility. When Superstar first opened on Broadway in 1971, the depiction of the last days of Christ was viewed as extremely controversial. Now that those attitudes and interpretations have settled in, although certainly not accepted by all or even many, we were driven to bring the Jesus story and its impact on the way we live, to a relatable setting. We explored the same history in a different time setting and with different circumstances, circumstances that we, in our society, find challenging. In doing so, we set up three distinct areas of focus; the realm of the church, the business world and the beauty-love-sex market. All areas that come into play in the original production and constantly parabled in the Bible. It should not be implied that being religious, successful or beautiful is, in any way, wrong. The issue is how important these goals are to our well-being, how do we achieve them and what is motivating us. The conflict between materiality and spirituality repeats itself throughout time. How do we trust the intangible? And to what extent do we reach for the "truth". As Webber/Rice put it, speaking through Jesus, "Neither you Simon, nor the fifty thousand, nor the Romans, nor the Jews, nor Judas, nor the twelve, nor the priests, nor the scribes, nor doomed Jerusalem itself... understand what power is, understand what glory is...understand at all."

THE SECOND COMING OF SUPERSTAR

When Jesus Christ Superstar opened in 1971, it revolutionized musical theater. The subject matter had been addressed earlier that year Off-Broadway in Godspell, but whereas Godspell was told from the point of view of the disciples and used clowns, "flower children" and other feel-good imagery, Superstar was originally released only as an album. Producers at first did not dare take a chance on a much darker concept relating the last seven days of Jesus's life told from Judas's perspective - which was that Jesus was not God, but merely a man. But although The Who had released the concept album for the first "rock opera" two years before with Tommy, Superstar would become the first ever to be staged on Broadway.

Thirty years later, though, what was once innovative is now dated. The challenge facing Gateway's creative team was how to take the songs and story - still as powerful as ever - and energize

them so that they would speak to a new generation. Taking inspiration from science-fiction messianic films such as *Roadwarrior*, *Aliens, The Terminator*, and especially *The Matrix*, collaborators Robin Allan and Matt Karris (who also directed) decided to set the show in a post-apocalyptic future, in the year 3027. The set, designed by Kelly Tighe, suggests a ruined landscape featuring partially destroyed landmarks, without concretely setting the show in any particular city.

Costumes were designed by Marianne Dominy to echo what life after a nuclear blast might be like. Suggesting a world where there was no mass production, where raw materials are scarce and people are more self-sufficient, the clothes are functional and utilitarian, heavily worn, even threadbare. Male actors were encouraged not to shave or cut their hair.

The music also needed updating. Karris and Allan listened to hours of popular songs recorded over the past twenty years, select-

ing those they felt corresponded to the *Superstar* score. Musical Director Vinny Trovato incorporated new arrangements for the *Superstar* songs using new guitar lics, drums, keyboard, trumpet, trombone, and based it on the influence of music by U2, Alanis Morrissette, 3 Doors Down, Train, etc. The result is less of an orchestral sound and more like a band, edgier, and reliant on the rhythm section instead of strings.

Seeing this *Superstar* is like watching a music video live on stage. But all the modernization and transformation does not diminish the work itself. "We are still dealing with a universal truth," said director Karris, "making it new has actually increased the impact of the show."







COMING IN DECEMBER

Gateway Playhouse is proud to present The Moscow Stars On Ice, in the world premiere of their new show Millennium Nutcracker, at Patchogue Theater in December. Last seen here in 2000 when Gateway presented their Alice On Ice and Kidz Klassics at Patchogue Theater, this talented team has been working hard all

year to create a spectacular, fresh version of the Christmas classic. The troupe has updated the arrangement of the familiar Tchaikovsky score - the well-known music now has a jazzier, more electronic beat as the timeless story unfolds on the ice. And yes... it is REAL ICE!

Gateway Performing Arts owns a Yontzmat portable ice rink which uses state of the art space age materials and solar technology. The rink is framed using recycled plastic lumber. A polyethylene liner is placed over one inch thick, high density insulation. Coils, constructed from HiTemp solar collector material, are laid on top of the plas-

tic liner and connected to one end of the frame where piping will pump 65 gallons of antifreeze per minute through the paneled coils at 5 degrees F. The antifreeze is chilled by a 60 hp compressor parked behind the theater. 5000 pounds of crushed ice are laid down over the coils, and watered every 15-20 minutes to

build the layers of ice. Installation takes 4-6 hours and the ice builds to skating thickness in 12-14 hours.

Performed by World, European and Olympic Champions on extraordinarily sumptuous sets, in exceptionally elaborate and imaginative costumes by Russian theater veteran Natela Abdullaeva, this production will enchant and thrill both children and adults. 

WALK to that Exit. However, under normal circumstances, when leaving the Theatre, use the center rear exits. SMOKING is prohibited in the BUILDING, as required by the Suffolk County NO SMOKING Ordinance. Smoking in any area designated "No Smoking" renders the offenders subject to a fine, or imprisonment, or both.
