Production Manager

The technical preparations for staging a musical are tremendous - if the set is to be built, lumber, steel, hardware, paint, and fabric must be purchased, hundreds of details seen to, and it is the job of the Production Manager to see that everything needed for the show is bought and delivered to the right hands.

"It's ordering supplies, and making sure they arrive, so everyone can keep working," said Gateway's new production manager, Houston native Stacy Cooper. "Then when the show is actually running, it's my responsibility to see that everything behind the scenes is working smoothly, and if it isn't, to get it fixed." Cooper works very closely with Technical Director Michael Boyer, who supervises all technical aspects of the production. Boyer sets a production schedule for building the set, which Cooper then implements. With Gateway's schedule of a new show every three weeks, there is no time to waste. "Four words I never want to hear are 'we're out of lumber'," said Boyer, "I can design scenery all day but if we have no lumber, we can't build it, and then we get behind."

"If we are closing in on deadline, then I can jump in the shop and take on a project," explained Cooper, who was first hired by Gateway nine years ago as a technician and works on shows in New York City in the winter. Even when Gateway rents a set, there are usually last minute changes if the director wants additional pieces or if something needs to be repaired. The set arrives only a few days before the show opens, and once it is unloaded and examined, decisions are made immediately. "It may mean building new pieces that night. It may mean cutting them from the show. The decision is determined by the size of the problem versus how vital the piece is to the moment in the play," Cooper said.

Cooper also does some purchasing for the lighting, sound, and costuming departments."For example, we had to order costume racks, so you find out which ones the costumer likes, then where do you get them? This time we found a new place. I'm trying to find more sources for us, so that we don't settle for something because we have no time to look around for other options," he said. Another job for Cooper is helping to find extra workers during "changeover" when the crew strikes one set and loads in the next. His biggest challenge in that regard will be at the end of August, when The King And I opens in Patchogue the same week that On The Town is extended in Bellport. This will mean two completely separate running crews, or about ten extra technicians.

The technical staff holds production meetings twice before each show opens and Boyer has additional meetings with the director. "Stacy is more into the entire season in some ways, where I have to be very show-specific," explained Boyer. "He can do other things related to the property and stockpile for the season." Cooper, meanwhile, has embraced the challenge of juggling all his responsibilities. "It's a mammoth position, but it's also a fun job, and I'm enjoying all of it," he said.

"Because of our ability to produce on a scale similar to the recent Broadway revival of the show we are not only presenting The King And I, we are creating another first class, professional production," said Allan. "We're taking your favorite show and producing it in a way that only Gateway can."




