Birth of a Union...

In May 1913 a group of just over 100 actors met in the Pabst Grand Circle Hotel to discuss the exploitive conditions actors worked under at the time. There was no pay for rehearsals and producers could hold as many rehearsals as they wanted. Producers set their own pay scales and working conditions, and actors had no say in how they were treated. Actors had to buy their own costumes, and if a show closed out on the road, the actor had to make his own way home. The result of the meeting was the formation of Actors Equity Association, leading producer George M. Cohan (the subject of Gateway's "Yankee Doodle Dandy" in 2000) to remark, "I will drive an elevator for a living before I will do business with any actors' union." (Shortly thereafter a sign was posted in Times Square reading "Elevator Operator Wanted. George M. Cohan Need Not Apply.")

Cohan was not alone in his sentiments, no one else took the fledgling union seriously, either. So in 1916, Equity president Francis Wilson proposed affiliation with the American Federation of Labor, despite the facts that a charter had already been granted to another performers' group and actors did not want to think of themselves as laborers. By the following year, a standard contract had been worked out with United Managers' Protective Association but less than 20% of managers used it. In 1919, the contract expired, and the performers' group gave up their charter. Affiliation with the AF of L was a reality. The new Producing Managers' Association, however, was determined to crush Equity, which led to the first theatrical strike in history that same year.

The 1919 strike demanded recognition of Equity as the actors' representative and bargaining agent. The first day of the strike, the casts of 12 shows refused to go on and 1200 new members joined the union. Day by day, the PMA was dis-



mayed as more casts refused to go on, other unions supported the strike, theatres closed in Chicago as well as on Broadway, and more and more actors joined Equity.

After 30 days, 37 closed productions, 16 prevented openings, and a loss of \$3 million, the strike was settled and Equity was recognized. Cohan never signed an Equity contract, however, he was allowed to work in professional productions with a special dispensation from Equity. The strike made Equity a force to be reckoned with - before the strike the union had 2,777 members, afterwards it had grown to 14,000.

This year marks the 90th birthday of the Actors Equity Association and more than 45,000 actors and stage managers are today represented in the United States, with branches in Britain and Canada. In addition to negotiating wages and working conditions, it provides benefits including health and pension plans, and seeks to advance, promote, and foster the art of live theatre as an essential component of our society.



Spotlight On... Electrics

The beautiful morning in *Oklahoma!* The misty 6 AM skyline of *On The Town*. The softly lapping river in *Show Boat*. *Jekyll & Hyde's* shadowy London night. None of these settings could be evoked without the work of the designer, master electrician, and crew who create, install, and run the lighting for every show.

The lighting designer works in collaboration with the director, set designer, costumer, choreographer and actors. The master electrician first

sends the designer a current inventory of lighting instruments, and then the designer reads the script to see what effects are written in. such as lightning, night scenes, etc. Following that, he meets with the director to learn what other effects will be used. "It's important to be



in the preliminary meetings with the set designer and the director so we can get a concept down of the approach we will take," said Phantom designer Chris Landy. The designer then drafts a lighting plot, which is an overhead view of the stage with the lights drawn in. Each light is indicated by a graphic symbol representing the type of lighting instrument and the accompanying paperwork shows which circuit and dimmer it is plugged into and which channel on the computer will control it.

Once the design is on paper, the next step is for the master electrician and his crew to hang the lights according to the lighting plot. A big show in Patchogue will require 8-10 crew members to take down and re-hang the lights. "Every instrument hung in the air has four separate numbers to identify it, instrument number, circuit number, dimmer number and control channel, so organization is key," said master electrician Brian Loesch. After everything is in the air, the designer comes in to work with the electricians on focusing the lights, which can take up to 14 hours. "Focusing is when the designer takes his concept of what each light was going to do, and we try to get it as close to that idea as possible. Is the color really what they intended when they chose it? Is it able to hit the spot on stage as planned, or does it need to be changed?" explained Loesch.

Whenever the look of the stage is changed, it is called a "cue." Conventional lights have one control channel that brings the light from zero to full intensity. Intelligent fixtures, also called moving lights, have 24 or more different control channels each, so besides changing the intensity, technicians can change the size of the beam, the color, the pattern, the patterns can rotate, the

light itself can move. In a conventional show with 200 or more lights hung there would be only about 100 different control channels to adjust on any given cue. With the new moving lights, there can be more than 500 channels to adjust for one lighting cue. Each moving

light can cost anywhere from \$500 to \$15,000. "Shows have gotten bigger," said Loesch, "In 1998 Phantom was considered a 'huge' show. This year, Miss Saigon was more than double that size with twice as many dimmers, twice as many instruments, and three times as many cues. The computing power of the lighting board in 1998 would be insufficient to control the moving lights alone in Miss Saigon."

At the first tech rehearsal, the electricians try to set as many basic cues as they can. "Then we go back, adjust it, and add in all the internal cues," said Loesch. The designer usually stays for a day or two after the show opens to clean up and finesse the design. Throughout the run of the show, the master electrician is ultimately responsible for maintenance and repairs on the instruments. To run a show, there is the operator for the computerized lighting board, and two follow spot operators. A fourth electrician may be on stage to run cable for "practicals" like the helicopter in Miss Saigon or other special effects.

The industry continues to change and grow, innovative technology is developed every day, and Gateway continues to explore new options to keep bringing the best high tech wizardry to Long Island audiences.


