


A Letter from the Producer



In 1977, composer Andrew Lloyd Webber and lyricist Tim Rice had already created the hit musicals Joseph And The Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, Jesus Christ Superstar, and Evita, but creative differences were causing their partnership to collapse. Webber decided to challenge himself. Instead of writing the music first, for the lyricist to work from later, he wanted to see if he could set music to words already in existence. He remembered the poems Old Possum's Book of Practical Cats from his childhood, and chose the book by the late T.S. Eliot to be the lyrics for his next project.

Eliot loved cats, and had written the poems over several years, sending them in letters to friends and their children. His publisher, Faber and Faber, collected them into a book, originally titled Mr. Eliot's Book of Pollicle Dogs and Jellicle Cats As Recited To Him By The Man In White Spats. But Geoffrey Faber thought it "impolite" to mix cats with dogs, so the book was published as Old Possum's Book of Practical Cats, in a run of 3005 copies in 1939.

There are a few uncollected and unpublished Eliot cat poems, and Eliot's widow Valerie provided some of them to Webber, including a fragment of eight lines called "Grizabella The Glamour Cat". Two weeks before the opening, Webber was afraid that the score did not have a big hit song. Falling back into his usual habit, he composed "Memory" and approached Rice to write the lyrics,

but Rice's work was not used in the final score, and the Webber-Rice partnership ended permanently. Instead, Trevor Nunn, who had already written additional words for "Jellicle Songs For Jellicle Cats" wrote the lyric after the style and concept of Eliot's poem "Rhapsody On A Windy Night" - it is the only song in the show that does not use Eliot's exact words. In 1981, Cats debuted to great success on the London stage, opening the following year in New York where it won seven Tony awards for its creators, including Best Book Of A Musical for T.S. Eliot. Eliot, who had always hoped his own plays would be more successful than they were, would have been delighted.

The show was an international smash, and was produced in over twenty countries. Most productions were as close to the original as possible, but some exceptions set the show in an attic (the Swiss production) or in the future (the Finnish production), while others cut parts of songs or dances. Recognizing that the show's popularity would cause further corruptions from his vision, Webber made his own preferred cuts and revisions, and released the definitive version of Cats this May, making Gateway one of the first to produce Cats the way the creator intends it to be produced in all venues from now on.

This doesn't mean there is no longer any room for creativity, though. There is no script for the show, only the score, which contains no director's notes, stage directions, or any indication of what the action should be. "The expectation seems to be that you will base it on original," Gateway's director DI Salisbury, who, together with musical director Jeff Buchsbaum has envisioned the show with a new thread weaving the storylines together - a kitten that the adults are teaching. "I want to show a clearer sense of the continuity of life, community," and explained Salisbury, "she becomes a member

of our tribe as we release another member to a better life."

Webber does notate options - productions can decide between using a parody of an Italian aria or "The Ballad Of Billy McCaw". There are optional cuts noted in some of the dance music, and a bagpipe may be cut from "The Awefull Battle of the Pekes and Pollicles." But for the most part, the directors shape the story on their own. "We're not just telling everything, we are showing the audience the characters' interaction," said Buchsbaum. Concludes Salisbury, "We all have to

bring our imagination to it, we can decide what Grizabella's history is, we fill in the cracks, and it doesn't matter what language it's in. That's why I think the show ran so long – anyone watching had an interpretation, it was completely accessible in that way." Salisbury and Buchsbaum hope their retelling of the mythic themes in Cats reaches the audience in a deeper, more emotionally involving way.


Spotlight on Through-Sung Musicals

The cats don't say a word, but they sure do sing. Cats is an example of the "through-sung musical", where the entire show has no spoken dialogue. This fairly recent phenomenon, only taking hold of Broadway and the West End in the early 1980's, has its roots deep in the operatic tradition. Musical theatre before Oklahoma! was based on either music hall (the English version of American vaudeville), or operetta, which has humorous plots including some spoken dialogue.

"There are many challenges to a through-sung musical," said musical director Jeff Buchsbaum. "There is no time for the pit musicians to recover and look ahead, we just play straight through to intermission, and the actors must

convey everything about plot and character through music." Buchsbaum has been musical director for several of the through-sung musicals produced at Gateway, including last year's blockbuster *Miss Saigon*. "That show had 300 pages of music!" he said.

Book musicals allow the emotion to build in dialogue to ultimately release in the song. But through-sung musicals have different rules. "For example, in Miss Saigon, the challenge was what to make important if everything is sung," explained Buchsbaum. Most through-sung musicals are offshoots of opera in that they have strong storylines, like in Miss Saigon, Les Miserables, and Caroline Or Change. In Cats, however, the structure is based in English Music Hall – each Cat



has his own act to demonstrate his personality, the only one with a through-line for the whole show is Grizabella. Director DJ Salisbury and Buchsbaum both felt that it was important for the audience to understand why the other cats don't welcome Grizabella, which is never fully explained in the score. "I've always gotten the impression she has made terrible mistakes which she regrets, that it is too late for her now," said Buchsbaum, "and that the other cats fear what she represents. In 'Memory' she forgives herself, and that is why the others start to accept her."

A great deal of the show is exposition, so the actors have to be sure to understand the backstory of their character and bring it to the forefront for the audience's benefit. The full ensemble sings in 17 of the 21 numbers in *Cats*, much more than is usual in the average through-sung musical. "The music is so playful, though, and the songs are so different from one another, that it is really built to be entertaining, the sound keeps changing," said Buchsbaum.

Opera is the reason Buchsbaum is a conductor today. "I was pre-med in college and was dragged to the Met against my will. I saw Beverly Sills sing and it was such a moving experience it changed my life," he said. After attending Rutgers University, he moved to New York to become an opera singer and worked with Placido Domingo's opera company for a season. He also studied acting and took non-musical parts, but felt that as a conductor he got to put everything together.

Six times he has conducted orchestras in Poland and Hungary to record scores for touring musicals, but he is most proud of the latest one, another through-sung musical, *Titanic.* •






