

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

#### **JEREMIE ARSENAULT** (Diabolo)

It all started in 2004, when I got accepted in Ouébec Circus School. The program includes technical and artistic coaching, contemporary and classical ballet dance classes, as well as classes in physical theater. The first two years of the program were 20 hours per week, and last two years have been 40 hours per week. During the past five years, I have had the chance to perform many times for different events, such as private shows organized by Ciraue du Soleil, GOP Varieté-Theater, circus festivals as La Piste aux Espoirs in Belgium, Krystallpalast, Startissimo and SOLyCIRCO in Germany, 250 summer shows in which I performed both juggling and acrobatics in a theme park in the United States, as well as many corporate events.

THE GARZA FAMILY (Living Statues) is a slow-motion acrobatic balancing trio which does their work painted in solid silver. The act creates art form, from ancient Greek and Roman statues. The three members slowly assume statuelike positions moving into their acrobatic balancing formations silhouetted by a center spotlight.

#### Who's Who

The Garza's studied ancient Greek and statue-like formations Roman learned to slowly mold themselves from one form to another. The Garza's have spent many years researching the poses they currently use in their performances. The act has evolved from ordinary temple hand balancing to an amazing display of strength and grace. display a combination of grace, beauty, strength, and athletic discipline. The marble sculptures are reminiscent of the celebrated human form in ancient Greece. The poses they have selected are easily recognized by Greek and Roman poses. Whether or not the audience is familiar with the ancient statue-like forms. The Garza's are able to impress them with their remarkable display. For this manner, The Garza's were nominated as the "Act of the 80's" on the Las Vegas Strip. They performed twelve straight years with the show City Lites at the Flamingo Hilton and also Bal du Moulin Rouge at the Grand Hilton. They shared the stage with artists like: Vic Damone, Jim Nabors, Charo, and Suzanne Somers to name a few. The Garza Family introduced the slow-motion hand balancing act or "Living Statue Act" into the United States. Every place The Garza's perform they have the audience twisting and shouting for more. They have been imitated, but not replicated!

LAURA **HALEY** (Dancer) received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Dance Performance from Hofstra University, and is currently teaching and choreographing for studios around the country. 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
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


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

He was inducted into the Theatre Hall of Fame in 2001. Recently, The Museum of the City of New York celebrated Mr. Colt's work with Costumes and Characters: The Designs of Alvin Colt.

BRIAN LOESCH (Lighting Design) is proud to be part of the Gateway Family for his fourteenth straight season. Gateway Playhouse lighting design credits include: A Christmas Carol (2006 & 2010), Avenue Q, Sophisticated Ladies, Forbidden Broadway (2008), The Full Monty, A Holiday Spectacular On Ice (2004 & 2009), South Pacific, Footloose, Jesus Christ Superstar, Kiss Me Kate, Holiday Hop (1999). Urinetown, Mooseltoe. Cabaret and numerous children's theatre productions including Peter Pan (2004) and Jungle Book (2005). Brian graduated with a Degree in Technical Theatre from Suffolk County Community College. Other design credits include Language of Angels (Henry Street Experimental Theatre, NYC), Paraffin Touch (World Premiere at Suffolk County Community College), The Man Who Would Be King (World Premiere at the Antrim Playhouse), and Kiss Me Kate (Cape Fear Regional Theatre). National Tour credits include George M! (2003 Candlewood Int./Mainstage Productions), (2004 Candlewood Int.), A Holiday Spectacular On Ice (2004 A Gateway / Candlewood Production), Mame (2005-06 Candlewood Int.), Camelot (2006-07 Candlewood Int.), and the 2007 and 2008 productions of Mooseltoe (Semmelman Productions).

BRITTANY LOESCH (Scenic Coordinator) graduated with a BFA in Theater from Pace University in New York City. Previous designs include Violet, Kiss of The Spider Woman, A Perfect Ganesh, and Iboga at Pace University, Language of Angels at the Abrons Art Center and Ouiet Crv (Passaii Productions) on Theater Row. Previous Gateway credits include Sophisticated Ladies, The Drowsy Chaperone, Avenue Q, as well as I Love a Piano for both set and projection design. Her 10 year journey from Intern to Designer has brought her all over the country touring with Rent and Mooseltoe, as well as designing various children's theater productions. She has also just finished her first season as Properties Designer for the Actor's Studio Drama School in New York City. It's wonderful to be back working with such a great team this season!

JOHN FREEDSON (Producer) has been associated with Forbidden Broadway for most of its 27-year history and has produced the Special-Tony®-awarded New York company since 1994. John is also producer of the current national tour of the Off-Broadway hit I Love You, You're Perfect, Now Change. With his partner Harriet Yellin, he produced Forbidden Broadway at London's Menier Chocolate Factory, in Los Angeles, San Diego, Detroit, Denver and on tour, as well as Forbidden Hollywood in Los Angeles, Japan and Off-Broadway. He has directed both shows to acclaim around the world, winning Jefferson Award for Best Direction for the Chicago production of FB. Mr. Freedson co-produced 8 Forbidden Broadway CD's for DRG records and, long-ago, appeared Off-Broadway and productions. As a composer/lyricist, he wrote three hit children's musicals: Swan is Born, Aesop's Follies and Country Mouse/City Mouse, which toured with the New England Theatre Guild. His voice can be heard on numerous radio and



television spots and Jingles, two Forbidden Broadway CD's and Disney's Aladdin. Originally from Reading PA, Mr. Freedson attended the Boston Conservatory and is a graduate of Brandeis University.

HARRIET YELLIN (Producer) produced and managed Forbidden Broadway in Boston, which ran for over six years, as well as the Los Angeles, San Diego, Washington, D.C., Detroit, and Denver productions of the show. With John Freedson, she is co-producing the current Forbidden Broadway SVU in New York and was a co-producer of Forbidden Hollywood in Los Angeles, Chicago, Japan and New York. She was co-producer and General Manager of Forever Plaid in Boston, and is currently the CFO for Blue Man Group, with shows running in New York, Boston, Chicago, and Las Vegas, Toronto, and London. In another life, she was a high-powered political consultant; clients included a variety of senatorial and gubernatorial candidates and she was National Media Director for the Dukakis and Tsongas Presidential campaigns.

### FORBIDDEN BROADWAY AND FORBIDDEN HOLLYWOOD

Forbidden Broadway was first seen at Palsson's Supper Club on New York's Upper West Side in January, 1982. What began as a simple cabaret act to give creator/lyricist Gerard Alessandrini a showcase for his talents and the opportunity to "find an agent" became New York's longest running musical comedy revue. Hailed by critics and audiences alike, Forbidden Broadway won Drama Desk, Obie and Outer Critics Circle awards and captured the heart of the theatre industry itself. Many of its legendary "victims," including Mary Martin, Ethel Merman, Bernadette Peters, Tommy Tune, Angela Lansbury, Stephen Sondheim, Hal Prince, and Andrew Lloyd Webber, were among the celebrities who stopped by to applaud first-hand. Updated regularly for each new theatre season, Forbidden Broadway ran to packed houses at the 75-seat Palsson's through August, 1987. September, 1988, the show re-opened at the 125-seat Theatre East, where it ran an additional 5-1/2 years. The show also became known for talented but as yet unknown actors, many of whom have gone on to stardom in various venues: Jason Alexander (Seinfeld's George Costanza), Chloe Webb (Twins and the PBS series Tales of the City). Davis Gaines (Phantom), as well as Roxie Lucas (Damn Yankees), Gregg Edelman (City of Angels), Dee Hoty (Will Rogers Follies), Michael McGrath (Spamalot, The Martin Short Show), and Brad Oscar (The Producers). Forbidden Broadway's success was repeated in Boston, where it enjoyed a 6-1/2-year stay at the 250-seat Terrace Room; Chicago and Boca Raton (over two years each), Toronto and Philadelphia (one year each), Kansas City (nine months and two return engagements), Denver (six months), San Diego (two engagements including Forbidden Christmas), a record-breaking run in 1994 at the Tiffany Theatre in Los Angeles, Sydney, Tokyo, and Singapore among many others. In 1999, after a sell-out engagement at London's Jermyn Street Theatre, it transferred for the summer to the famed Albery Theatre in the West End. Forbidden Broadway's return to the Tiffany Theatre in Los Angeles in the spring of 2000 garnered two more Ovation Awards. Mr. Alessandrini's next spoof, Forbidden Hollywood, first appeared as a section of Forbidden Broadway in Boston in 1989. After several years of work on the project, the full length version previewed in San Diego, then opened in Los Angeles in March, 1995. The run at the Coronet Theatre delighted audiences for nearly a year and was nominated for seven Ovation Awards. Whoopi Goldberg, Carol Channing, and many other luminaries of the "industry" showed up to see themselves and their friends lovingly parodied. The show was subsequently produced in Chicago (which garnered three Jefferson Award nominations), Kansas City (a record-breaking run), and Toronto. It was updated for New York and ran off-Broadway in 1996, and has had numerous successful runs across America since that time. In the fall of 1996, the Forbidden crew, including John Freedson and Harriet Yellin (producers), Phill George (Associate Director). and of course. director Gerard Alessandrini, turned their attention back to their first love: Broadway. A new edition of the show, Forbidden Broadway Strikes Back! returned to New York and its original home on West 72nd (now called the Triad and expanded to 135 seats), where it once again delighted audiences with its fast-paced spoofs of current Broadway shows and stars. The return of FB was again greeted with raves from critics (The New York Times called it "triumphant") and the show won the Drama Desk, Lucille Lortel,

and Drama League Awards. Bob Hope,

Bea Arthur, Stephen Sondheim, Angela Lansbury, Savion Glover, George C. Wolfe, Elaine Paige, Rosie O'Donnell, Dame Maggie Smith and the casts of Lion King, Aida, and Rent are among the recent attendees. The show moved to the Douglas Fairbanks Theatre on 42nd Street with a brand new edition, Forbidden Broadway 2001: A Spoof Odvssev, which won the 2001 Drama Desk Award for Best Revue. Forbidden Broadway's 20th Anniversary Edition was followed by Forbidden Broadway: SVU, which won yet another Drama Desk Award for Best Musical Revue in 2005. Most recently, the show was recognized with a Tony Honors Award, for being an integral part of the theatre community for over twenty-five years. As long as there's a Broadway, Forbidden Broadway will be there, poking, prodding, teasing, pleasing, jeering and cheering, but always, with love.

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

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
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#### THE CORNELL GUNTHER COASTERS.

This year marks the 35th anniversary of the formation of Cornell Gunter's Coasters out of the ashes of the surprising breakup of the original Coaster group several months earlier.

Few people recall anymore the historical significance of Cornell Gunter's decision at the time to "fly in the face of the wind." After all, he thought he could form a new group that would overcome the sudden lack of public interest in The Coasters' music, and 1950's music in general. And he thought he could do so by relying, in part at least, on Coasters' music. Cornell believed that there was a new and unique way to present 1950's music and clearly a new approach was needed because the early 60's brought about a stunning and sudden change in American musical tastes. The Beatles

and psychedelic music were around the corner and almost overnight The Coasters, along with all of the other purveyors of the oldies group sound (The Drifters, The Shirelles, The Platters, to name a few), went from living as stars in the spotlight to being unable to get a new record played on the radio.

Looking back, given the current popularity of their type of music, it is hard to believe that this immensely popular art form could have fallen into disfavor so rapidly, joining such other fads as disco, calypso, big band and swing; all of which disappeared from the music scene.

Like aging football players or silent movie stars, the 1950's group members all seemed headed for their new lives out of the limelight. Enter Cornell Gunter. Cornell believed that The



Coasters could be reborn. In fact he believed that all of the groups from that era could be reborn, and thrive as live performing groups and ultimately he led the way to what was soon to become known as "the rock revival." All that was needed was to take the original music and present it in a way that gave each group a modern theatrical approach to their presentation. More important, he developed an approach music that lent itself to to 1950's constant innovation.

And slowly but surely the fans returned. So unique was Cornell's approach to The Coasters' music and 1950's music in general that within a year Cornell Gunter's Coasters were headlining in Las Vegas for six months out of the year. Soon The Drifters, The Platters and other 1950's groups following Cornell's lead, were reconstituted as live performing groups, all with their own unique style. By 1969, came the first oldies stations and oldies shows that still fascinate the country's musical taste today. In fact, by the early 1970's, all of the original Coasters had formed their own individual groups of Coasters and were touring extensively, both separately and on certain occasions, together. All because of this "crazy idea" of Cornell Gunter.

Over the years, Cornell Gunter's Coasters has continually built up a new market for their approach to 1950's music. If you've seen the show, you will know what we mean when we say, "you are in for a surprise." Today they are as much a comedy act as a singing group. It's The Coasters' music through the eyes of Salvador Dali. It's definitely not your mother's music.

It has been ten years since Cornell passed away. Since that time, his sister Shirley (who was an original member of The Platters and had been Cornell's manager and the creative force behind the group) incorporated Cornell's genius into the group's ongoing homage, to not only The Coasters' music, but to Cornell himself.

It is under her tutelage and guidance that the group continues to entertain today. And today Cornell Gunter's genius still lives on in the way Cornell Gunter's Coasters present themselves on stage.

THE **MARVELETTES** occupy esteemed place in the history American popular music as the group that caused Motown, and most notably Berry Gordy to change the label's focus from single bluesy soul artists (previously Barret Strong's "Money" had been the label's biggest seller) to a smooth orchestrated harmonic sound that transcended the prior racial limits of rhythm and blues. With their first record, "Please, Mr. Postman" hitting the top spot on the charts and selling 3 million records in a crossover market Motown was to concentrate on the Marvelettes, Supremes, Temptations, Four Tops, and Martha and the Vandellas and create a new group pop soul sound that totally dominated the music charts until the advent of the Beatles 4 years later.







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During their reign at the top of the charts the girls were to turn out over a dozen hits, eight of which went Top Ten. Although the group at times had more than three members, the originators were Wanda Rogers, Gladys Horton, and Katherine Shaffner. In the early years of the group, family ties forced all three to leave the act at various times (although Wanda and Gladys continued to make frequent "guest appearances") but carefully chosen and highly talented replacements kept the act at the top of the charts even with changed personnel. Once again this is a patented mark of Motown's success story-the ability to change personnel in acts like the Supremes, Temptations and the Marvelettes and still keep an act at the top of the charts and in demand for personal appearances.

In fact it is in person where the current lineup really excels. Offering an act that features Motown standards, interspersed with their versions of some great contemporary songs, the girls are still, in the smooth Motown vein, a highly choreographed, polished, very good looking and humorous night club act as well as a major draw.

THE PLATTERS first formed during the dawn of the rock & roll era, early part in the 1950's. At the outset, the group included five teenagers, Tony Williams (their legendary first lead singer) along with Zola Taylor, Herb Reed, Paul Robi and David Lynch, Initially under the direction of their famed manager, Buck Ram, and continuing to this day under the direction of current management, some of the greatest singers in rock & roll history have passed through this group.

The list of hits turned out by the

original PLATTERS includes ten songs that qualified for Billboard's list of the 500 greatest rock & roll hits of all time, including three in the top 50. They have had 21 top 10 records, 9 million selling singles, 5 platinum albums and 5 number 1 songs. Their total record sales exceed 200 million, making them one of the top 25 selling artists of all time (source: Billboard Magazine).

It has been nearly 30 years since the last original member left THE PLATTERS and still the group remains one of the most popular in rock & roll in history, continuing their popularity by becoming one of the most sought after performing groups in the country. Over the years the greatest of care has been taken to assure that each new member of THE PLATTERS carries on the tradition and maintains the skills that were associated with the original group.

The group has appeared all over the world, including President Clinton's inauguration and the coronation of the Queen of England, as well as on a good will exchange tour at the Great Wall for the Chinese government. Additionally they have appeared at such stellar American venues as Foxwoods Hotel & Casino, Westbury Music Fair, Madison Square Garden, The Houston Astrodome, The Sahara Hotel in Las Vegas and Trump Castle in Atlantic City. The group has appeared on such television shows as The Today Show, The Tonight Show, Good Morning America and Saturday Night Live and are currently promoting their latest CD, "The Platters Live in Las Vegas".

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
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
