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




Represented by over 35 musical and comedy productions, Rumors, Lend Me A Tenor, Into the Woods, Once On This Island, The Secret Garden, Beehive, Cabaret, The Drowsy Chaperone, Big River, Carousel, Tommy and last season's Sweeney Todd are among his favorites. Regional credits include productions of Romance, Romance, I'm Getting My Act Together and Taking It Out on the Road, Pump Boys & Dinettes, Little Shop of Horrors, Working, Company, South Pacific and Grease. Dom received The Connecticut Critics Circle Award for this production of *Phantom* in 1993 and the Best Director and Best Musical awards for his production of Tommy. He has also been the recipient of Best Director awards for his direction of Into the Woods, Bia River and Little Shop of Horrors. Dom is the co-creator with Jeffrey Buchsbaum and director of their original review, The Magic of Musicals, which played an extended run in Athens and Thessaloniki Greece.



Christopher J. Landy (Lighting Designer) came out to Gateway 24 years ago. 16 years ago he designed Phantom. Since then he's been pretty busy. He went on to receive his MFA in lighting and scenic design from NYU, marry the love of his life Ellen, have two amazing children, Max and Samantha, and bought a house in the country. Professionally he enjoyed a successful career in theatre, opera and dance, designing nearly 30 productions for Gateway alone. before shifting his efforts into television and starting his own design and production firm, Vibrant Design. Clients include NBC, CBS, MTV, VH1, Comedy Central, TLC, AMC, Style Network, Oxygen, NBA, CMT, ION, Food Network, BET, FX, CNN, MSNBC and MSNBC. He has been fortunate to works with the likes of Jimmy Fallon, Jerry Seinfeld, Chris Rock, Alec Baldwin, Colin Ouinn, and even President Barack Obama. Some of his favorite music he's lit include U2. REM, The Roots, Coldplay, the Dead Weather, Jay Z, LL Cool J, Justin Timberlake, Dave Matthews, Vampire Weekend and Katy Perry. He's been nominated twice for an Emmy and actually won one. 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Gateway's 'Phantom Four'

Ithough Arthur Kopit and Maury Yeston's Phantom is presently known as Gateway's most requested show, in 1993 — the show's debut year in Bellport — it was an unknown quantity.

"I remember going to see it in Westchester with Ruth and Paul Allan, as well as John Hodge (one of Gateway's former producers)," director Dominick Ruggiero said. "We only knew that

it was another phantom musical. But we fell in love with it. It's such a human piece."

Since then, each version of Phantom — 1993, 1997 (twice) and 2003 — has reunited Ruggiero with music director Jeffrey Buchsbaum, costume designer José M. Rivera

and lighting designer Christopher Landy. The current production marks the fifth installment for the Phantom Four.

The original staging received Connecticut Critics Circle awards for Best Director and Best Musical while at Gateway's Candlewood Playhouse. It then transferred to Sarasota, FL for 27 weeks and was named The Tampa Tribune's Best Musical of the Year.

"Sometimes I can still hear that cast in my head. The principle actors carried through with the show until Chester Ludgin passed away in 2003."

Buchsbaum has fond memories of Ludgin, the star baritone of the New York City Opera and Gateway's original Carrière.

"I was in my 20's at the time, and here was the man that Leonard Bernstein wrote an opera for. He told me that I had the skills to be a conductor. That was very large in my life." Although the 2003 production was not

without its share of talent — including Bradley Dean, fresh off a leading role in Broadway's Man of La Mancha — the current production is a testament to the growth at Gateway, and the evolution of the Phantom Four, in the past 19 years.

"Every time we re-mount *Phantom*, it gives me the chance to add a fresh perspective, even though many of the lights are the exact same instruments," Landy said. "In terms of color and movement, each time ups the ante."

"Back in '93 we built the costumes and masks

from scratch," Rivera said."This year we've been able to add new costume items for Carlotta and Christine, as well as a new mask for the phantom. The opening number is more colorful, like a Monet painting in Paris."

2012's Phantom also reunites

"It's like having a repertory company," Ruggiero said. "With this ensemble it's a collaborative effort. It's incredible how much we are able to push each other."

Since 1993, both Landy and Rivera have won Emmys in their respective fields. Buchsbaum has music directed shows for 20 years at Gateway, and most recently directed and music directed Phantom of the Opera in Indonesia. Ruggiero has led international tours, directed over 35 Gateway productions, and currently serves as the theatre's general manager.

"Each cast is uniquely different. And I'm a different person, close to 20 years later," Ruggiero said. "But with Chris, Jeff and José, we share an unspoken language. We grew up together."

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
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
